The High School

Metro Academic and Classical High School is a Magnet school in the Saint Louis Public School District. It is also accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. Since 2002, Metro has been an International Baccalaureate (IB) Affiliate School. The IB Diploma Programme is a comprehensive and challenging pre-university course that demands the best from both motivated students and teachers.

The Faculty

The faculty, staff, and administration are all dedicated to the students’ personal and intellectual development, and are committed to offering academic excellence. The faculty consists of 23 teachers, a full-time librarian, a counselor, a director of college counseling, a school nurse, a social worker, two administrators, and the IB Coordinator.

Class of 2014 GPA range: 2.3 —3.98. The Mean GPA is 3.2 on a 4.0 scale. A review of the ACT/SAT/IB and GPA profiles, supported by our students’ recognition in National Merit/Achievement Programs, provides an indication of the overall caliber of our students and the strength of our academic program.
