The mission of the St. Louis Public Schools Adult Education and Literacy program is to provide quality educational services to adults as they pursue a better life for themselves, their families and their community.



Who Are We?

The Adult Education and Literacy Program of St. Louis Public Schools is a part of the Division of Career and Technical Education. Adult Education and Literacy is designed to assist eligible persons 17 years of age and older, and out of school, to obtain the skills needed to function in society and to become more employable, productive and responsible citizens and family members. Students will also be provided the opportunity to improve their core literacy and numeracy skills to at least the level of a high school equivalency.

Where Can I Find a Class?

We currently have classes at over 30 locations and our service area covers six school districts, St. Louis City, Ferguson/Florissant, Hancock Place, Jennings, Normandy and Riverview Gardens. We also provide services to the City of Wellston. Our classes are hosted at a variety of locations including social service organizations, job centers, schools, churches and correctional institutions. Class times vary by location but are available mornings, afternoons and evenings.

How are AEL Classes Funded?

Our funding is through the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act and administered through the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. All eligible students may receive our services free of charge.

What Would I Study?

We provide opportunities for adults to participate in Adult Basic Education, High School Equivalency or English for Speakers of Other Languages. There is also curriculum designed to assist students with Workforce Development, Life Skills, Literacy Skills Enhancement, Family Literacy and English Language Civics.
