How much does camp cost?

Camp classes range from \$89 to \$99 per half-day session. Prices for individual topics are listed for each campus class offering. All materials are included. In addition, each child in the program will receive a "Kids on Campus" T-shirt. Please indicate preferred size on the enrollment form.

Is lunch included?

Lunch is not included. Full Day campers must bring their own sack lunch.

• For both Wildwood and Florissant Valley, there will be a structured 30-minute lunch break from 12 p.m.-12:30 p.m. (between morning and afternoon sessions).

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
