# JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY

## (1917-1963)

The second male child of a large and influential family, John F. Kennedy shared the heroics of war with his older brother Joe. When Joe was lost to that war, the mantle of leadership fell on Jack. Just as Elisha took up that mantle and led a great nation . . . so did Jack Kennedy.

His heroism as a naval officer in World War II proved to be a springboard into politics. Congress, the U.S. Senate, and finally all his political dreams were realized in his election as President of the United States.

The 1960 Presidential campaign was hard fought. John Kennedy used all his naval and political moxy, charm, wit, and youthful vigor to capture a narrow victory and lead this nation into "Camelot." The young "Arthur" had overcome huge obstacles and brought with him vision, hope and confidence long lacking in our leadership.

. . . .

January 20, 1961 — John Fitzgerald Kennedy is inaugurated 35th President of the United States. In that ever familiar Boston cadence, words split the cold air that have echoed through the years to speak to today. . . .

. . . LET THE WORD GO FORTH FROM THIS TIME AND PLACE, TO FRIEND AND FOE ALIKE, THAT THE TORCH HAS BEEN PASSED TO A NEW GENERATION OF AMERICANS,

born in this century, tempered by war disciplined by a hard and bitter Peace, proud of our ancient heritage, and unwilling to witness or permit the slow undoing of these human rights to which this nation has always been committed, and to which we are committed today at home and around the world.

Let every nation know, whether it wishes us well or ill, that we shall pay any price, bear any burden, meet any hardship, support any friend, oppose any foe to assure the survival and the success of liberty. . . . Let all our neighbors know that we shall join with them to oppose aggression or subversion anywhere in the Americas. And let every other power know that this hemisphere intends to remain the master of its own house.

We dare not tempt them with weakness.

For only when our arms are sufficient beyond doubt can we be certain beyond doubt that they will never be employed.

. . . let us begin anew, remembering on both sides that civility is not a sign of weakness, and sincerity is always subject to proof. Let us never negotiate out of fear, but let us never fear to negotiate.

. . . Together let us explore the stars, conquer the deserts, eradicate disease, tap the ocean depths and encourage the arts and commerce.

Let both sides unite to heed in all corners of the earth the command of Isaiah to "undo the heavy burdens . . . and let the oppressed go free."

. . . All this will not be finished in the first one hundred days. Nor will it be finished in the first one thousand days, nor in the life of this Administration, nor even perhaps in our lifetime on this planet. But let us begin.

. . . Now the trumpet summons us — not as a call to bear arms, though arms we need; not as a call to battle, though embattled we are; but a call to bear the burden of a long twilight struggle, year in and year out, "rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation," a struggle against the common enemies of man: tyranny, poverty, disease, and war itself.

. . . The energy, the faith, the devotion which we bring to this endeavor will light our country and . . . all who serve it, and the glow from that fire can truly light the world.

AND SO, MY FELLOW AMERICANS, ASK NOT WHAT YOUR COUNTRY CAN DO FOR YOU; ASK WHAT YOU CAN DO FOR YOUR COUNTRY.

John Kennedy had been President for 1,037 days. There was trouble within the party and President Kennedy had been summoned to the rescue. The reception was more than could be expected. The crowds were warm, the sun was warm, the air was cool and crisp. A loud retort rent the air. Camelot was shattered. Our young "Arthur" lay slain, but his spirit, his vision, his mystique lives on.

It is to his vigor and vision, to his imagination and inspiration, to his strength through struggle, . . . to his memory . . . we dedicate this book . . . because . . .

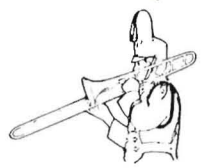
## “GIANT STEPS TOWARD EXCELLENCE”

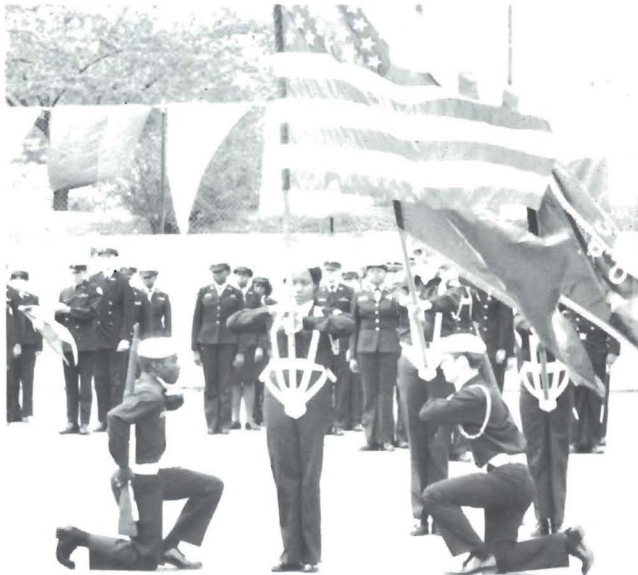

# Orienteering Club

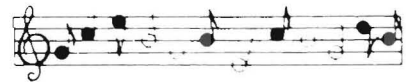

# GLEE CLUB

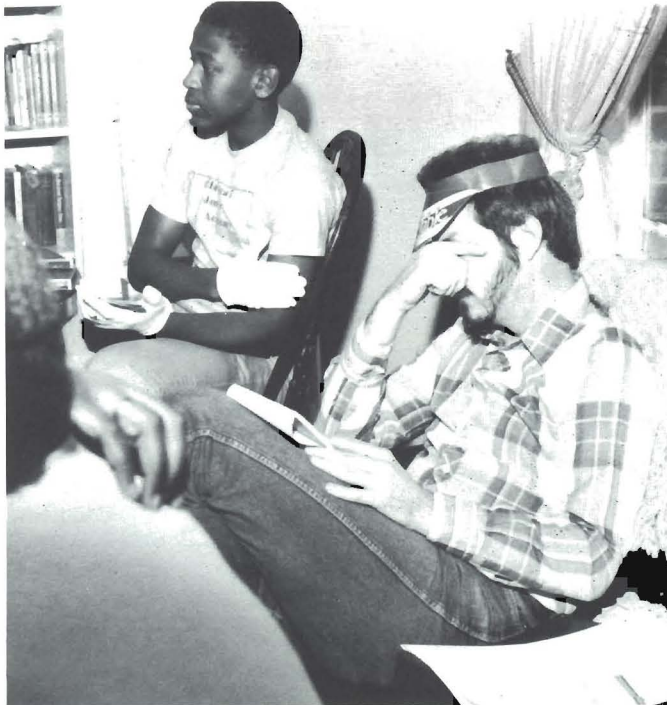

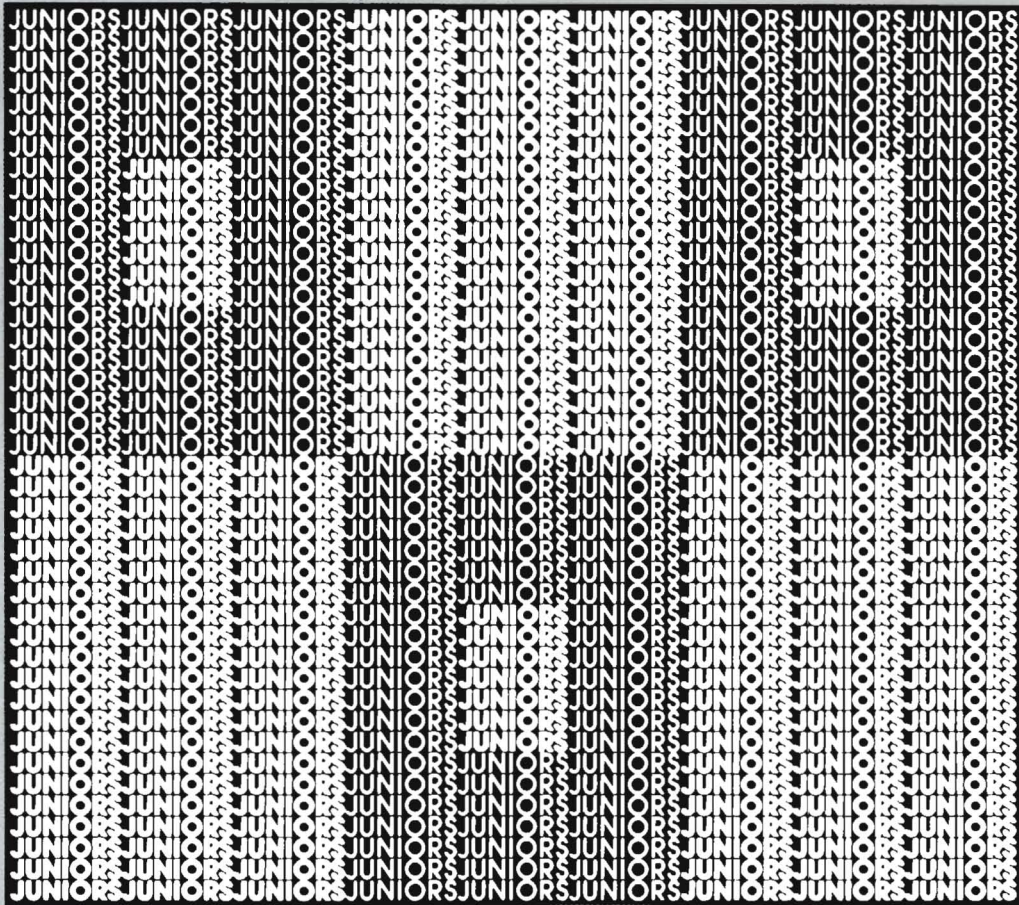
The Varsity team has prior shooting experience whereas the Junior Varsity does not.

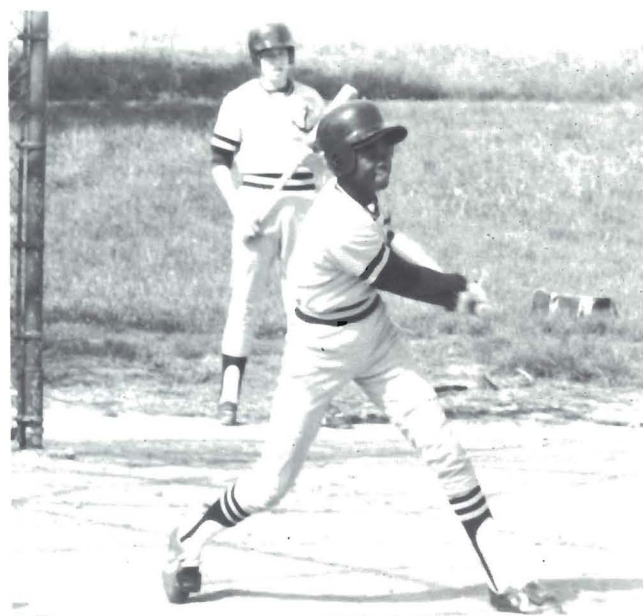
