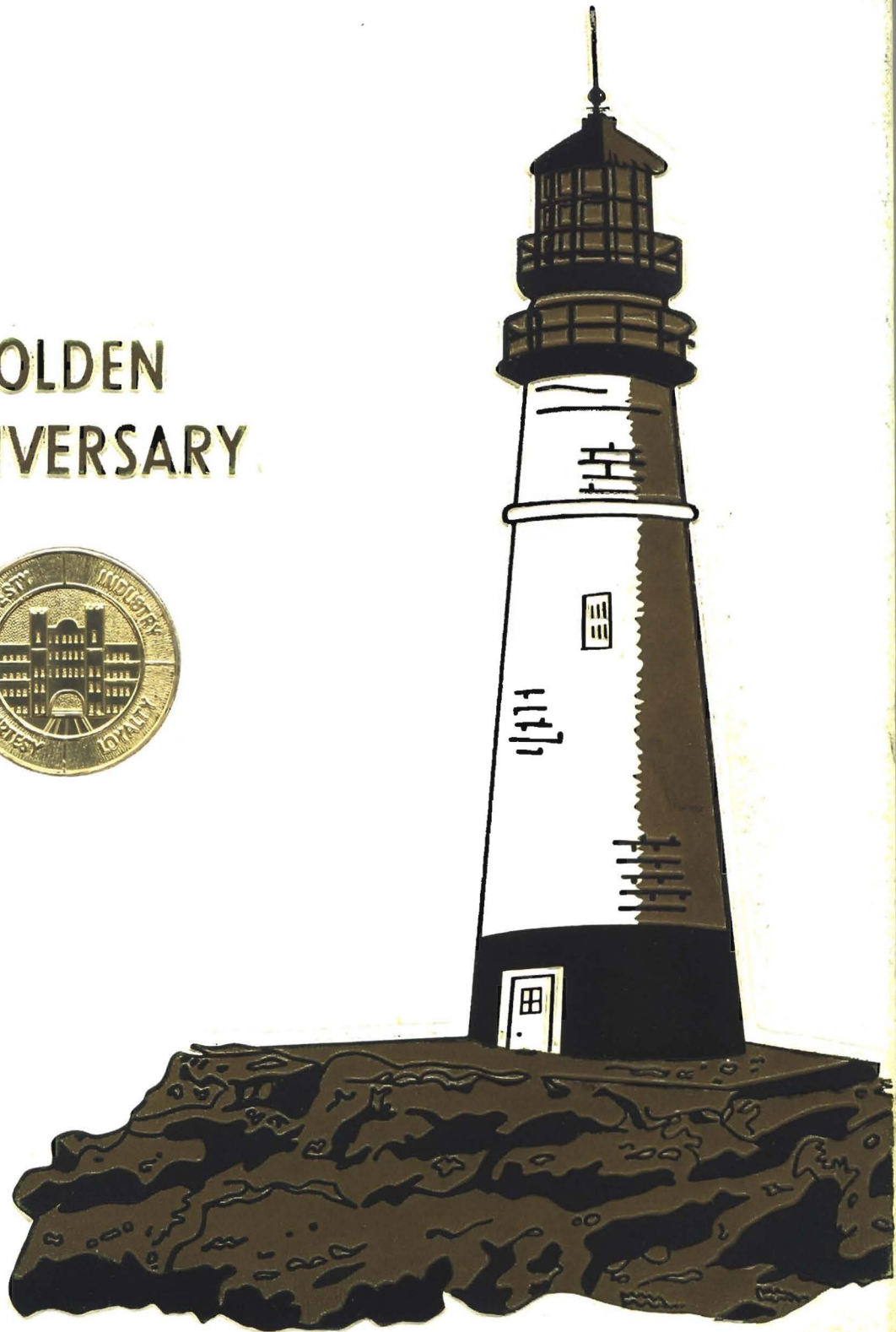

Each has devoted over 35 years in educating Clevelandites. To these four people, Bessie Campbell, Lelia Gunther, Charlotte Pope, and Ernest Schueneman, this book is dedicated.

Miss Lelia V. Gunther began teaching physical education at Cleveland in 1927. She was instrumental in introducing many new activities in the girls' physical education program which resulted in an ever-growing Girls' Athletic Association. At the end of the year this Program culminated in an enormous "Girls' Play Day," in which the entire student body participated. Her warm personality and genuine affection for her pupils resulted in her being elected senior class sponsor many times. For the past few years she has taught freshman English classes.



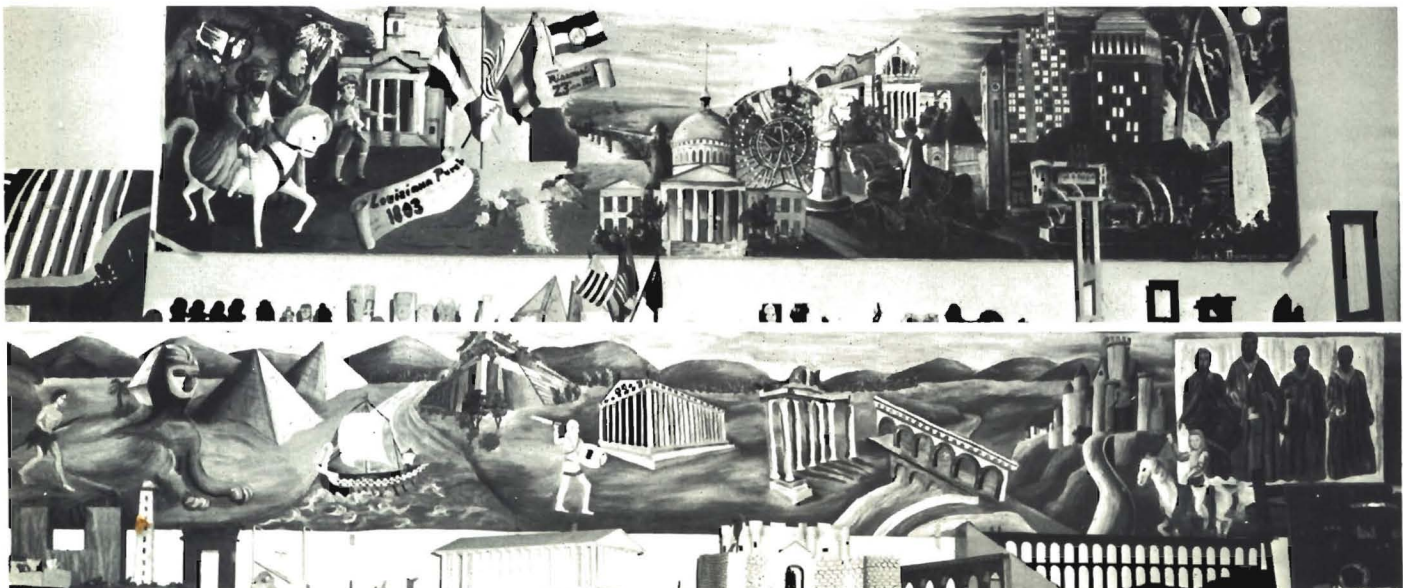

The Cleveland High School Faculty welcomed Miss Charlotte E. Pope to the faculty as a music teacher in 1931. She was responsible for the organization of the boys' glee club and the accordion band. Miss Pope began teaching social studies in 1938, and her summer travels greatly supplemented her already interesting history background. Room 11 has become a "museum" because of the various student projects and murals which have been made for Miss Pope. These helped to make her history classes more interesting and beneficial to her students.





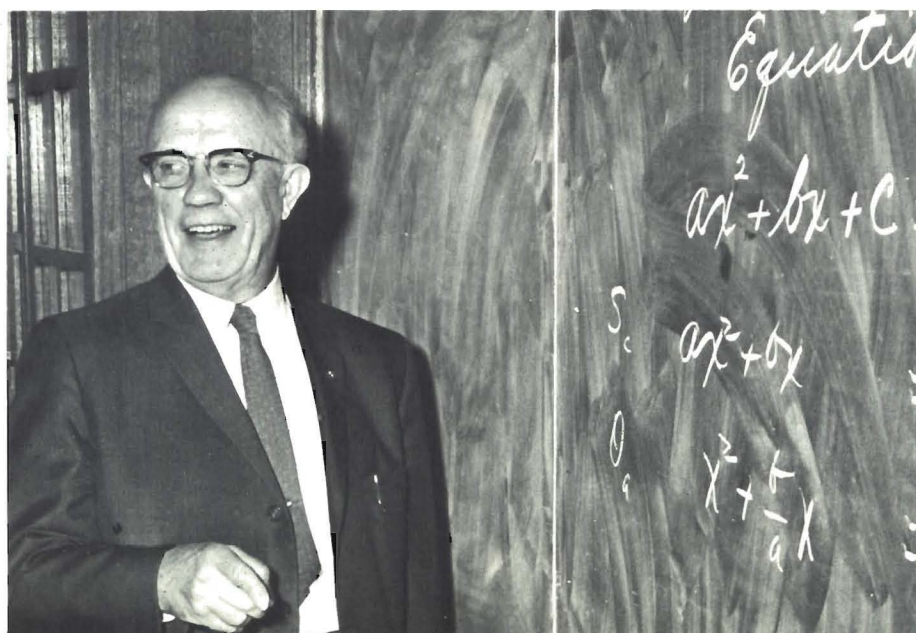
His chem-is-tree.

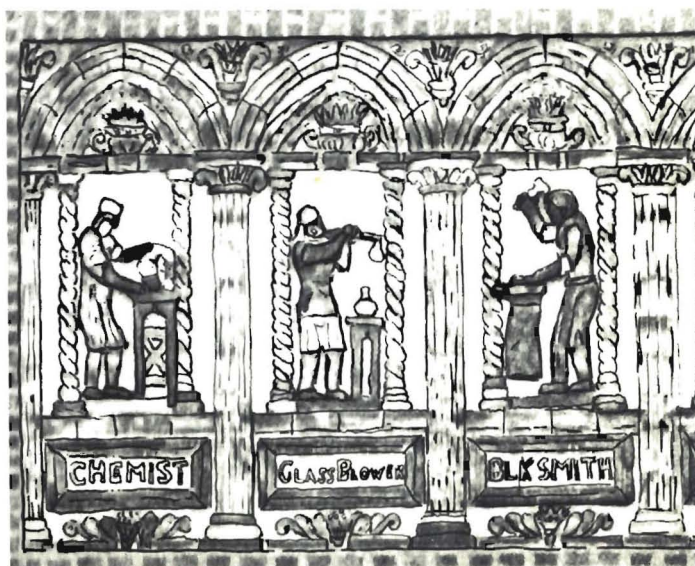

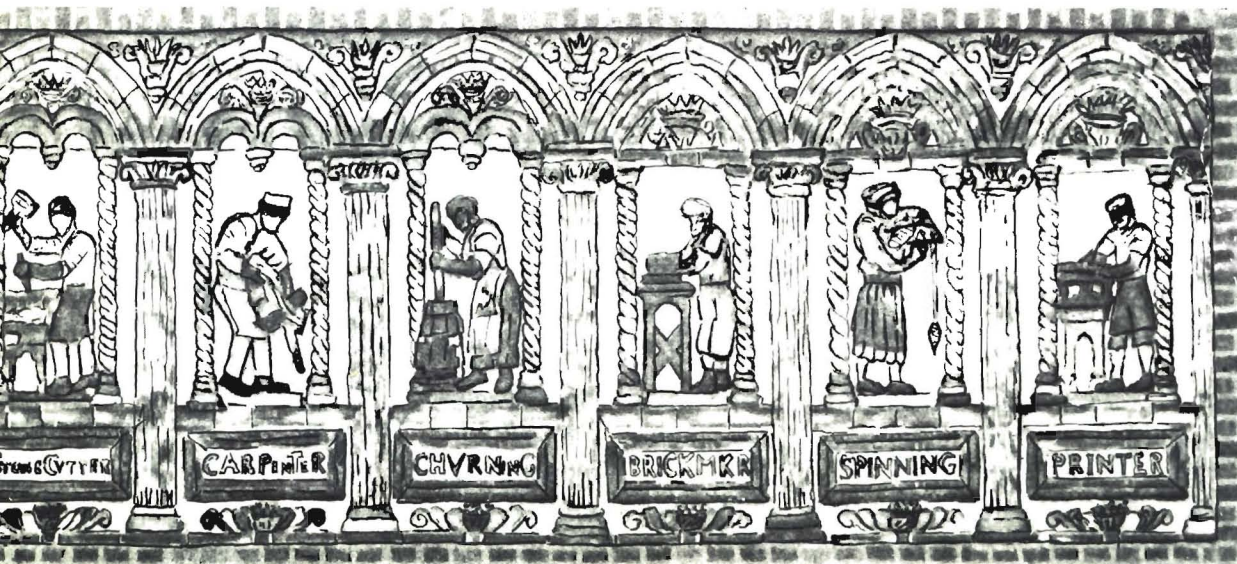




# Foreword

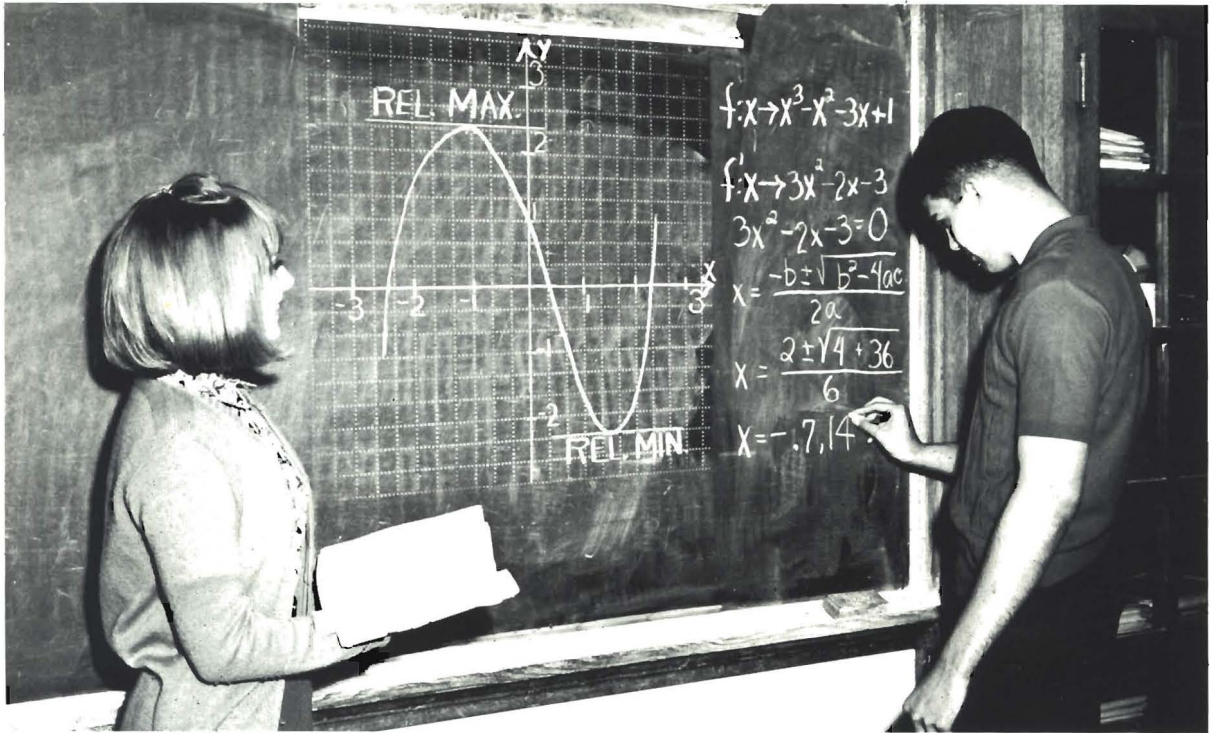

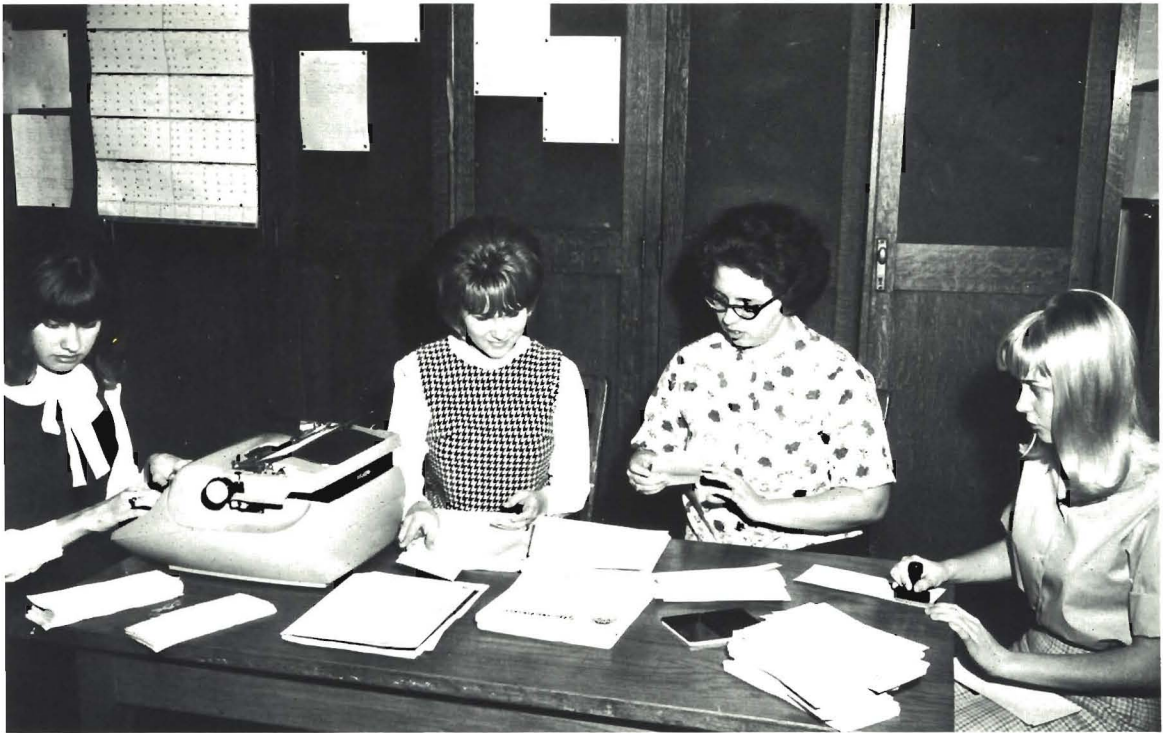

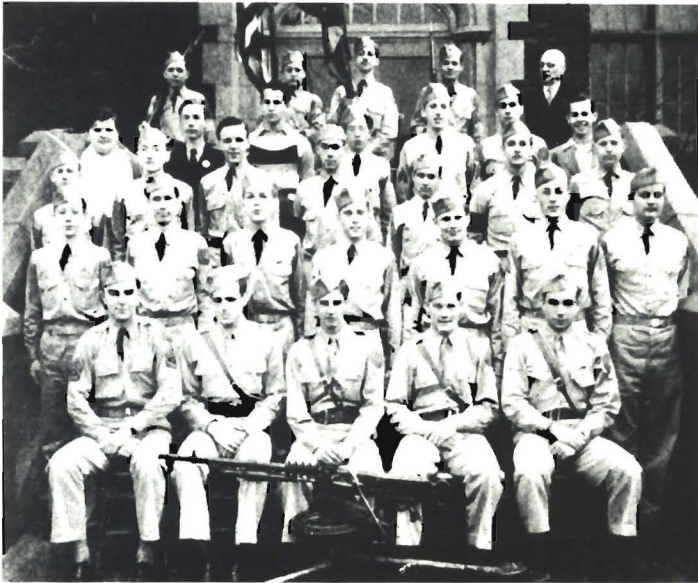

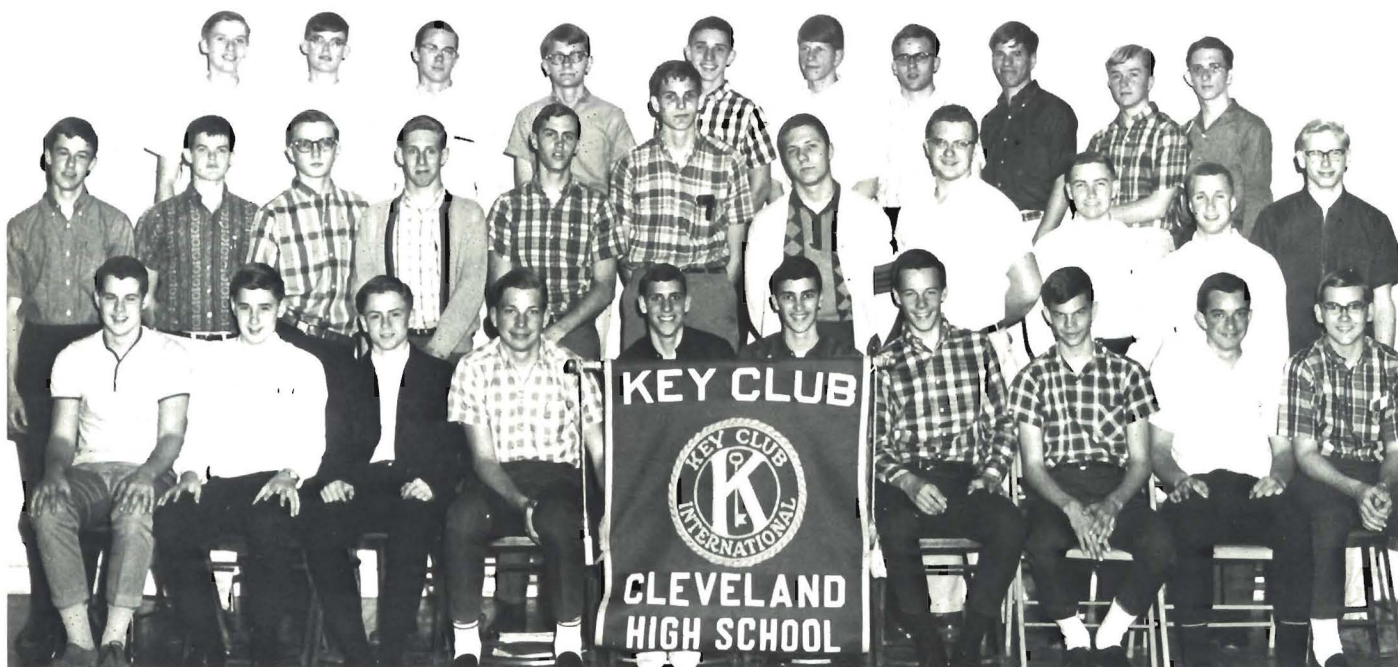


The Key Club is a service organization sponsored in part by the school, and in part by the South Side Kiwanis Club. The club's purpose is to serve Community, school, and home through various projects.

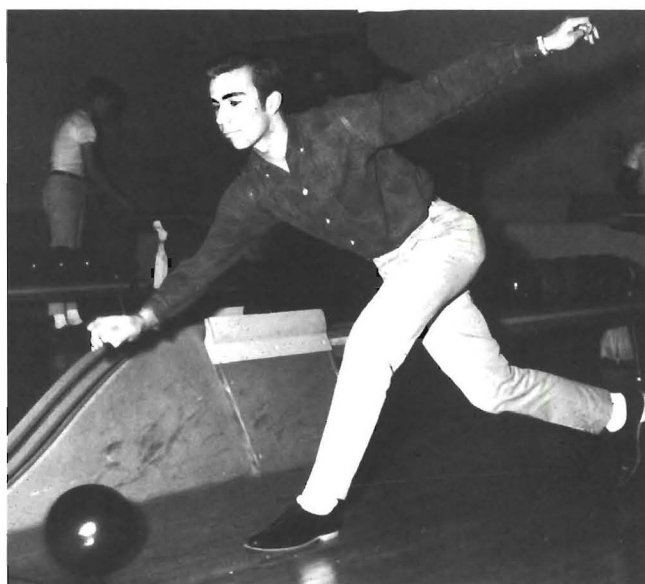

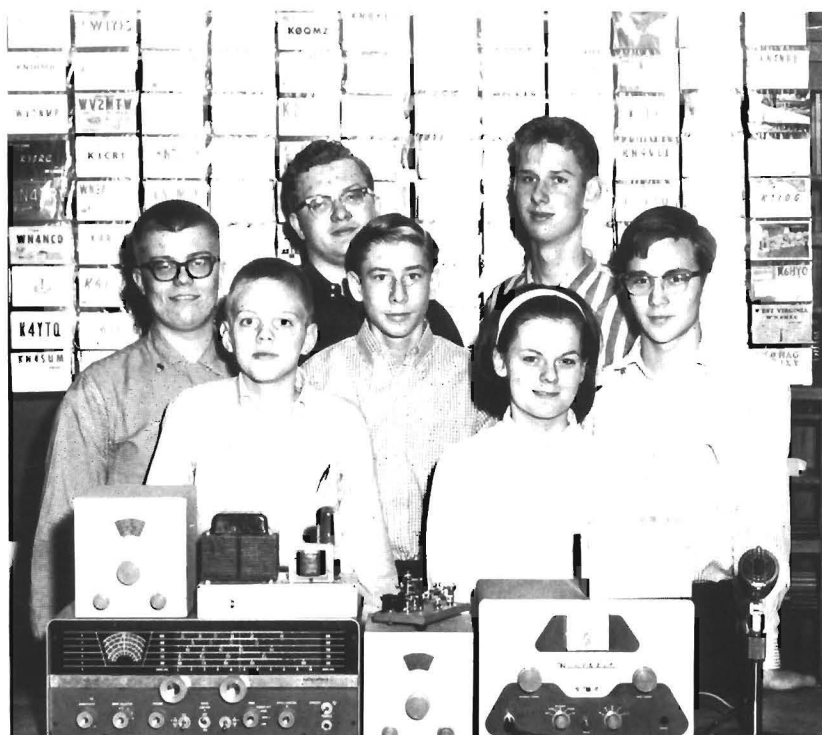

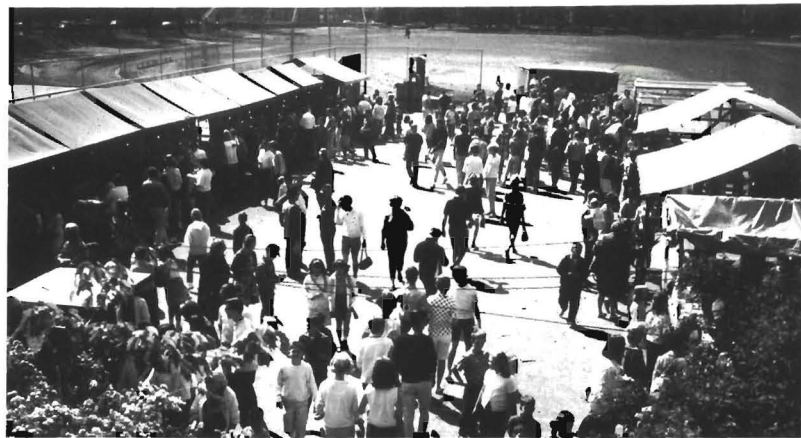

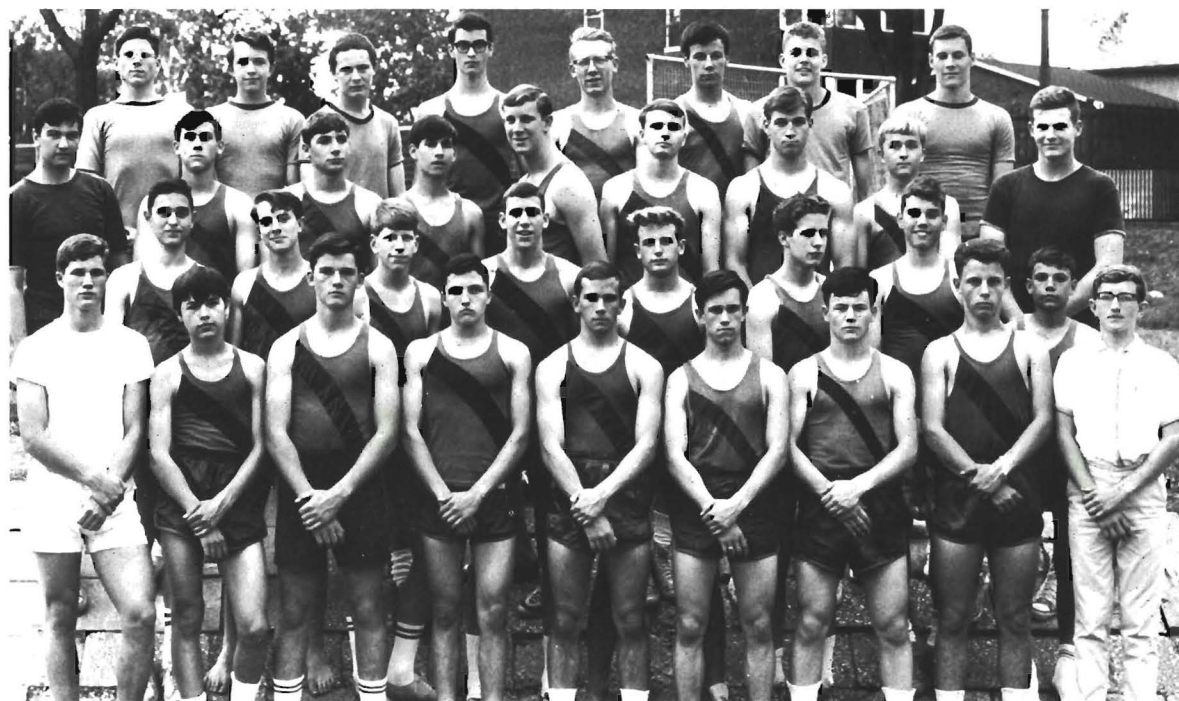

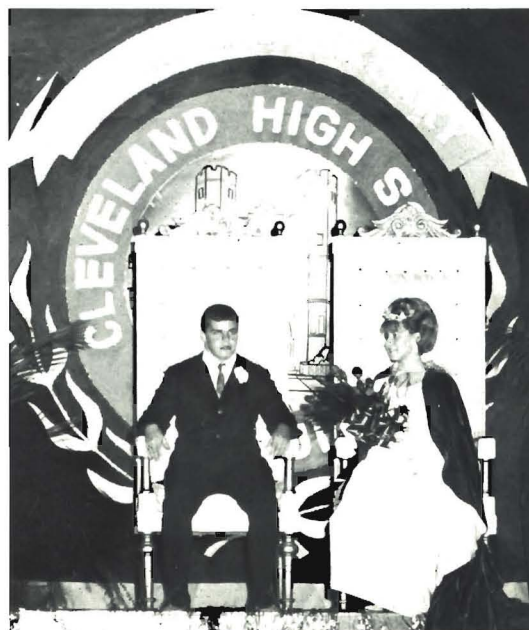
