Hispanic Heritage Month: Viva La Raza y Cultura







Hispanic Heritage Month is celebrated from September 15th-October 15th

September 15th marked the beginning of National Hispanic Heritage month. On October 10th, Long International Middle honored and celebrated Hispanic Heritage month with books for this year's first Literacy Night entitled "Libros, Juegos, y Fiesta" (Books, Games, and Celebration). National Hispanic Heritage Month celebrates achievements, histories, traditions, diversities, and cultures of Hispanic and Latinx Americans. For Long, this month and celebration is important because we are a school of internationality: the student, staff, and community make-up is one of the most diverse in the St. Louis Public School system. With almost 300 students, Long provides education, access, and opportunity to 130 immigrant and refugee students and families--that is nearly 50% of our student body! Of the 130 students, half of the students are Spanish speakers with home countries of Mexico, Honduras, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Haiti, Guatemala, Columbia, and the Dominican Republic.

During our Literacy Night, we invited families to learn more about the countries represented by our Spanish-speaking families by engaging in traditional games from Hispania, Spain, Mexico, and Brazil. Food was catered by our local Mexican restaurant, Mariachii's II on Gravois--the food, as always, was muy fuego!! Each family and student were able to select from one of the Hispanic culture-based novels: MexiKid (Pedro Martin--Mexican), Flora La Fresca & The Art of Friendship (Veronica Chambers--Spanish), Enchanted Air: Two Cultures, Two Wings (Margarita Engle--Cuban), and Esperanza Rising (Pam Munoz Ryan--Mexican), as well as picture books for early literacy readers. As the year continues, we look forward engaging our parents and families in additional activities and events. Our next upcoming event is Wednesday, October 30, 2024 for Trunk or Treat and Tricks at Long International Middle School.


