## What Are We Learning?

- The month of September was all about testing! Students completed their first assessments of the school year, including the STAR early literacy assessments, math and English/Language Arts CFA district assessments, and baseline/placement assessments as part of our math and English/Language Arts curriculum. These assessments will help us see where our students are, look for strengths, target learning objectives for October, and see how we can group students together for better learning opportunities!
- Reading Workshop Students are exploring fiction and non-fiction works, and learning about characters, setting, and parts of a book (title, author, etc.). All students will continue to daily work on building phonics & phonological awareness skills to learn early reading strategies and how different sounds are put together to make words. Some students may be working on early letter recognition, connecting letters to their sounds and/or ASL sign, and reading high-frequency sight-words both alone and in short reading-level appropriate books.
- Writing Workshop Students will work on independent writing of their full name and sight-words, as well as copying or writing simple sentences with capitalization and punctuation. We will also work on upper- and lower-case letter formation and proper pencil grip and control. Soon we will begin our writing journals and collaborate on coming up with stories!
- Math We will continue to work on counting using our words and signs, as well as connecting a number of objects to the
  right matching numeral. Students will explore recognizing, identifying, and counting with one-to-one correspondence with
  numbers 0-10, as well as comparing these numbers, using different manipulatives and games. First graders will also work on
  simple addition and subtraction problems and using strategies like drawing pictures and crossing out items to find answers.
