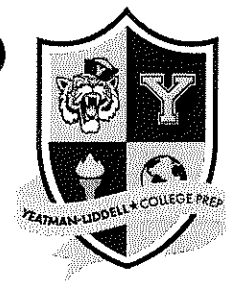

School Responsibilities

Yeatman Liddell Middle School and its Staff will:

- 1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating students to meet the Missouri's student academic achievement standards as follows:**

- 2. Hold guardian/parent teacher conference to discuss:**
 - A. Each student's academic, social progress and hi/her IEP,
 - B. Each student post secondary future
 - C. This "Compact" with each parent and how it measure will help each student to achieve
 - D. Last conduct a Parent/Teacher Conference at the close of the 3rd quarter to discuss each student's progress and future challenges.
- 3. Provide families with frequent reports on their student's progress**
Specifically the school will provide reports as follows:
 - A. Have each teacher communicate via letter or email parents every week
 - B. Have each teacher phone the parent every month and discuss the student's progress
 - C. Send home mid-quarter progress reports and report cards to parents.

Student Responsibilities

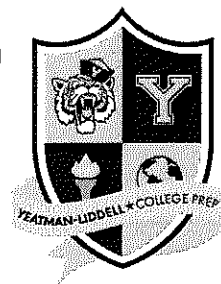
7. We, as students will share the responsibility to improve our academic achievement and achieve the Missouri's standards. Specifically, we will:
