School Hours & Attendance

Daily, on-time attendance is critical for your child's academic and social development. All students are expected to attend school 95% of the time.

Arrival & Dismissal

All students enter the building through Door 6 (Howell Street) beginning at 7:50 AM. Breakfast is provided for all students each day.

The school day ends at 3:02 PM. Students who are pick-up may be picked up beginning at 3:00 PM from the gym. If you need to change your child's transportation on any given day, please communicate this change with the main office by 2:00 PM. The main office is closed from 2:30-3:00 PM each day and students must be picked up from the gym.

Dress Code

All students must come to school in uniform clothing every day.

- <u>**Tops**</u> Powder blue, White, Green, or Navy
- Pants, Shorts, Skirts, and Jumpers Tan, black, khaki, or navy; NO JEANS
- <u>Footwear</u> students should wear athletic shoes on their assigned PE days so that they may fully participate in activities; <u>Flip flops and sandals</u> <u>are never to be worn for your child's safety.</u>

For students' comfort, they may wear jackets, sweatshirts, and hoodies, but hoods may not be worn.

On Fridays only, students may wear jeans (may not have holes) and a uniform shirt, Nance T-shirt, school/college short, or shirt representing an extra-curricular activity. Students who do not follow the school dress code will be asked to contact parents/guardians to bring appropriate clothes to school. For repeated violations, a conference with school staff may be required.

Cell Phones & Electronic Devices

In accordance with district policy, students are <u>not allowed to have cell</u> <u>phones visible or in use during the school day.</u> Phones must be stored in book bags in classroom lockers each morning. Violations of this policy may lead to cell phones being confiscated. In case of emergency, please contact the main office to reach your child.
