Consumer Mathematics Syllabus 2020-2021

COURSE FRAMEWORK:

Consumer Math - students will understand our economy, manage family and personal finances, and make informed purchasing decisions. Understanding credit, budgeting, insurance, warranties, and shopping skills help ensure our students become more confident and capable consumers.

Applied Practical Math- students will build a basic mathematical foundation using a step- by step- approach. Skills are mastered by teaching students the basic operations involving whole numbers, integers, fractions, per-cents, and decimals. Calculator skills are taught and Algebra is introduced simply as math with letters and numbers.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

The Autism classroom is set-up to address the student's Individual Educational Plan. My hope is that you will use the information you learn in this class to increase your mathematical skills. Also, throughout this course we will try to cultivate knowledge and skills that will allow you to be successful in college.
