The Adult Education and Literacy Program of St. Louis Public Schools is part of the Division of Career and Technical Education.

We assist eligible persons 17 years of age and older, and not enrolled in school wanting to acquire their High School Equivalency Degree.

Students will be provided the opportunity to improve their core literacy and numeracy skills to at least the level of a high school equivalency. We offer basic computer skills to assist an individuals to become a contender in the workforce.
