For your information...

- **Backpacks**-Please make sure your child has a backpack (big enough for a folder). I will also be giving each child a folder that will travel from school to home each day. This folder is how we will communicate with you on a daily basis and where we will put homework and completed assignments to come home. Please make sure your child's backpack, coat, and other belongings are **labeled**.
- Extra Clothing- Accidents sometimes happen in our classroom whether it is a puddle on the schoolyard, a spill at lunch, or a potty accident (sometimes we have so much fun, we forget to go potty). Please send a full set of clothes to school in a gallon Ziploc bag. This bag should be labeled and each clothing item should be labeled as well. Items in the bag should include underwear, socks, pants, and shirts.
 - **Snack** It would be greatly appreciated if you could send a snack for about 20 students at the beginning of each month. This includes dry snacks (crackers, rice cakes), or fresh fruits and veggies (eaten first).



- Homework- Homework will be handed out weekly and will be a review of what we are working on in class. Homework should only be between 5-15 minutes per night. This is a wonderful time to spend working with your child and a great prompt to discuss what he/she is learning in school. (Ex: working on a sheet writing the letter B. "I see you are learning about the letter B in school, do you know any words that begin with the letter B?"). In pre K, homework is not graded, and should never cause stress. It is just practice for when your child enters kindergarten and beyond.
- Reading- Research has shown that reading at least 20 minutes a night increases school performance. When reading, discuss the pictures, letters, and words on the page. You can also talk about parts of the book (i.e. characters, setting, and what happened throughout the story).

Ms. Judy is Ms. Finley's assistant. This is her 4th year at Dewey but has worked with children for over 30 years with children from Pre-K through middle school. She loves working with pre-k because they are eager to learn and love to ask guestions.
