In the wake of the horrific school shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Broward County, Florida, yesterday, all of us at the Saint Louis Public School District want to extend our sympathies and support to the families and staff of the Broward County Public Schools.

It is unthinkable and unacceptable to ever have a shooting in a school, but unfortunately, it has become all too common. As educators, our mission is to prepare children for the future. Equally important is our responsibility to protect them from harm and danger. We must insist upon better overall solutions to keep our students safe.

In the coming days, we will be reviewing our safety and security practices to ensure all students and staff are aware of their building's security plans and are prepared for how to respond during this type of incident and any others that may occur. For the safety of the school communities, these plans are not public, but they are routinely reviewed and adjusted, as needed, by our school safety leadership team.

The emotional impact of incidents like what occurred yesterday can be far reaching—beyond the community, city or state. I encourage any student or staff member who is feeling the effects of this tragedy, or experiencing symptoms from any other trauma, to speak up and talk to someone. Please be open to sharing your feelings and, conversely, kind to one another and willing to listen.
