#### **COURSE FRAMEWORK:**

Math Applications is designed to explore topics from Algebra and Geometry through collaborative application projects. It is intended for seniors who have completed Algebra, Geometry, Advanced Algebra, and require a fourth math credit.

#### LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By the end of the course, students will:

- Integrate problem solving techniques and modeling in both mathematical and real-world contexts.
- Use mathematics as a means of communication while reading, writing, and problem solving.
- Apply logical reasoning in making conjectures and validating conclusions.
- Recognize the connections within mathematics as a discipline through the interrelated concepts of Algebra, Geometry, and other areas.

# REQUIRED MATERIALS:

## CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS/POLICIES:

- 4) Food and Drinks Food is <u>NOT</u> allowed in the classroom. Drinks are allowed ONLY if in a plastic bottle with a screw top lid.

<i>C</i> —70-79	The student's work is satisfactory and may or may not be completed in a timely/independent manner.
D-60-69	The student's work barely meets requirements and work is not completed in a timely or independent manner.
F-0-59	The student's work does not meet the minimum standards of understanding or performance or work is not the student's personal best.

During projects there are no extensions on due dates because group members are absent. Make sure you are in class because your group is counting on you to be there!

#### ACADEMIC INTEGRITY/ PLAGIARISM:

Academic dishonesty includes cheating, falsifying information, copying an assignment, submitting the same assignment for different classes without permission, and getting answers for tests from another student.

Plagiarism is defined as presenting as one's own the words, the work, or the opinions of someone else without proper acknowledgement. Students are expected to complete their own work. Plagiarism will result in a zero on the assignment and a referral.

If you choose to copy an assignment from another student or if you intentionally give another student your work to copy, all students involved will receive a "O" for that assignment and their guardians will be notified. If this happens a second time, we will have a meeting with your vice principal regarding your academic dishonest.

#### Homework

As this is a group project-based class, there should be very little if no homework assigned. All work is done in class with your group or individually. Second semester your final is an individual project and may require out of class work to be completed.

# Turning in Assignments

Students will turn in their assignments/projects by the stated deadline. They should be clearly labeled with student name (first and last), the title of assignment, date, and hour.

#### Attendance

This class is primarily based on group projects and individual work. <u>Attendance</u> is the key to being successful in this class and your group is counting on you being here to help complete the project. Being absent will seriously diminish your ability to learn. If you miss a day of new material, it will be given to you and completed on your time. Each day you are absent will result in your points being deducted from the overall project grade as well as losing your daily participation points. Remember, participation points cannot be made up!!!

# Again, make sure you are in class because your group is counting on you to be here and so is your grade!

# Tardy to class
