Welcome and Introductions

Meeting called to order

Student Council Report

- Freshmen student council representative Zoe Zenson reported that Student Council is
 interested in organizing welcome baskets for CVPA students similar to those they created for
 Collegiate students. They will be in contact about how parents can support their efforts.
- They are interested in organizing a school dance on April 1.

Chairperson Report

- Teacher Appreciation Activities
 - First Friday Breakfast for continues to go well.
 - Discussion occurred about whether or not it was a good idea to return to the pre-COVID way of organizing first Friday breakfast, where individual parents from the hosting class sign up to bring in specific things. In the past a SignUpGenius was circulated prior to the first Friday. This would be less expensive for the PTO and might result in a great variety of food options.
 - It was decided that from now on it will be up to the parent class representatives whether they want to buy the items themselves (with PTO funds) or use SignUpGenius.
 - o PTO provided a Nacho Bar for teachers on Monday, December 19th.,
 - Teacher Appreciation co-chair Juanita House said that she will be in contact with co-chair Amanda Doyle to plan teacher appreciation activities for teacher appreciation week in May.
- Trivia Night (Linda S.)
 - The date is secured at Immaculate Heart of Mary, April 22, \$200 deposit has been made, 6-10pm.
 - Linda will be circulating a SignUpGenius for the various volunteering positions needed for Trivia Night. It will be sent out via Membership Toolkit and the PTO Facebook page.

Principal's Report (Dr. T)

- Admin met with the class of 2023. Relevant info she discussed with them included:
 - o Students have until this Friday to come up with a sweatshirt design.
 - Dr. T is offering the seniors two field trips paid for by the school and not their senior dues, they are in the process of choosing places.
 - The site for the senior luncheon has still not been chosen but they hope to do so very soon. Dr. T is looking at a number of possibilities, including Ballpark Village. The date for the luncheon will be May 19, the same day as the lock-in.
 - Prom is at Barnett on Washington
 - Students who are not academically successful are being asked to enroll in Edmentum,
 they are In conversations with some families about how to best proceed at Metro.

- BSU is planning their celebration for Black History Month the last week in February. They have a good outline of plans and hope to work with the PTO diversity committee. It will include an introduction to black sororities and fraternities.
- Metro Day of Service is scheduled for Monday. It is optional; the building will be open from 9-12. They will be cleaning out the storage room and doing service projects in the building.
- Metro is using ESSR funds to pay for new furniture for several classroom. All the other learning areas and café will also be getting new furniture. It will have a more collegiate feel.
- Dr. Perez started on Tuesday to take over for Prof. Valle as Spanish teacher. She is still looking for a more permanent Spanish teacher and would like people to contact her if they have any leads.

- March 18: Betty Wheeler ribbon cutting event at the site of the former Kennard School. Naomi Collier (of the Metro Alumni Association) and Dr. T will be involved.
- Parent concern was brought to Dr. T after holiday break regarding a photo on social media that
 included students with two visible bottles of alcohol. It was addressed through a discussion
 with students about digital footprints and the importance of being vigilant about what is posted
 on social media.
