Chairperson Report

- Teacher Appreciation Activities
 - First Friday Breakfast for December was provided by freshmen parent representatives.
 Dr. T said it was much appreciated. January breakfast will be provided by senior parent representatives.
 - PTO will provide a Nacho Bar for teachers on Monday the 19th.
- Book Fair at Left Bank Books (Genyne provided report)
 - Sales were significantly lower this year. We made about \$500 in credit for Metro to use (last year was approximately \$1200 in credit).

Principal Update

- Final exams begin tomorrow
- Teacher Updates:
 - Prof resigned for personal reasons, she will be missed. She is going to assist with whoever transitions in. Someone is identified to help temporarily: Marilee Perez. Dr. T does have some leads for a permanent replacement, and she is reaching out to all contacts.
 - Mr. Yentumi is on leave, we don't know for how long. Mr. Perniciaro is stepping in to create the final exam for his class (based on where they were in the curriculum)
 - There will be other changes with who teaches advanced algebra next school year. Dr. T. is advocating maintaining and strengthening the academic program at Metro.
- Seniors were able to meet with Jostens for class rings, 2023 gear etc. They're also they're organizing a senior photo with the Arch in the background.
- Dr. T is considering organizing a huge signing day for seniors, not just for athletes but for everyone. Looking into doing it at SLU's cultural center.
- Recruitment: We had over 360 applicants for 90 seats in the freshmen class. The majority of the students are from McKinley, then Gateway, Compton Drew, Busch, and then about 20 seats left that are charter.
- Planning for the summer: they want to offer some courses in the summer. The administration would like to offer more electives at Metro.
- Angel: Could students be surveyed about the kind of courses they'd be interested in? Dr. T: Yes. I know they're interested in contemporary issues class.
- Ami: Can you tell us more about summer offerings? Dr. T: Last year there were packets, and that was not ideal. She prefers teacher student interaction. She wonders if McKinley, Collegiate, and Metro could get together and coordinate on summer offerings.
