Chairperson Report

- <u>Student Grant Request</u> Student, Penny Peck discussed her grant request for \$490 to purchase robot kits for the Metro Robotics Club. The robots can be reused and they will be returned to Metro for future use. The request for \$490 was APPROVED.
- First Friday Breakfast Rebecca Diekemper said that Patty Schneider Gibson suggested bringing back the breakfasts since the teachers are back in the school building. Mr. Lawler suggested that lunches might work better than breakfasts. The PTO could provide a combination of a couple lunches and snacks. Ms. Gibson will work with the Class Reps to come up with a plan based on the budget. The proposed schedule below could possibly be used for planning lunches and snacks.

- Trivia Night Pat Matthews gave an update on the Metro Trivia Night, which will be on March 6th. She said they are hoping to have registration start on February 1st. Cost will be \$25 per adult per screen. Student groups can be beneficiaries of the 50/50 raffle by helping with the trivia night and creating a video. There will still be an opportunity for people to sponsor rounds. Film students will do a Metro video, which can play during the event.
- Recognition Reception Ms. Gibson agreed to help plan the reception. She said it might be nice to have a watch party with a presentation this year. Could use the platform Tribute and have coaches load videos of their speeches. Clubs could be included this year. Mr. Lawler said it would be good to have the event by April 23rd. Angel Were offered to help plan the event.
- PTO Board nominations for next school year Tricia Moyer will be forming a committee to collect nominations. Ms. Moyer has already served 2 years, so someone else will need to run for Parliamentarian. Ms. Diekemper has served as Chair and Vice Chair, so she does not plan to run again.

Treasurer's Report

• <u>2020-2021 Treasurer's Report</u> - Nicole Blumner gave the Treasurer's report. The teacher appreciation lunch in December cost \$309. \$2,306 was spent on hallway furniture, a water bottle filler and fogger.

Principal Update

Principal's Report

- Metro graduation is scheduled for Wednesday, May 26th at 6 pm at Busch Stadium. The graduation will be held for 6 schools.
- Teachers were surveyed about being back in person and they are feeling more comfortable with it. Mr. Lawler will send out a survey to students. Wifi seems to be working okay in the school.
- Mr. Lawler collected \$4,500 in donations for Metro families in need.
- Mr. Lawler plans to get more picnic tables for spring.
- Mr. Lawler is also thinking about getting tents.
- Juniors will take the PSAT on January 26th.
- Dave Custis gave an update on fall sports. He said fall sports will start Feb. 22nd and end April 12th. Students interested in sports should have received an invitation to join the MS Team for sports. They will need to submit a consent form as well as a form for COVID testing; both forms have been added to the MS Team. Students who want to play will have to be tested every 2 weeks. Fall sports testing starts January 30th. Mr. Custis is putting together a slide deck that Mr. Lawler will send out.
- <u>Naviance Presentation</u> Students could start using Naviance their Freshman year to start thinking about colleges. The online platform includes volunteer tracking through x2VOL, AP test prep and ACT prep. The cost is \$26,000 for 3 years; first year includes \$5,000 consulting fee, but Mr. Lawler will ask if that can be waived. PTO could pay for Naviance Curriculum Solution, which is \$4,750 per year. SLPS would have to agree to Naviance having access to SIS. Mr. Lawler would cover some of the costs from the school budget. PTO would need to agree to help cover \$20,000 over 3 years with about \$9,000 for the first year. The annual PTO fund drive could be used to fundraise for the amount covered by the PTO. Some of the activity fee money could also be used to cover it since the cost comes out to about \$25 per student per year.

Terms of Service for Naviance Participating High Schools

For good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the National Student Clearinghouse ("Clearinghouse"), a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, and the undersigned high school or high school district ("School") agree as follows:

- 1. The Clearinghouse provides a nationwide, central repository of information on student enrollment, degrees, diplomas, certificates and other educational achievements.
- 2. The School wants to obtain information on the attendance of its former students in postsecondary institutions. The School wishes to use the services of the Clearinghouse to assist in the functions as described below and designates the Clearinghouse as its authorized representative for this purpose.
- 3. The School will transmit to Naviance lists of its graduates ("Graduates"). Initially, it will transmit a list of Graduates dating back up to eight (8) years and, thereafter, will submit lists of new graduates each year after conferral of diplomas. In addition to the Graduates file, the School may also submit through Naviance lists of graduates and other former students in a format reasonably required by the Clearinghouse ("StudentTracker Request Files"), and the Clearinghouse will provide data to the School via Naviance on the subsequent enrollment and educational achievements of these students at postsecondary institutions. The Clearinghouse reserves the right to reasonably limit the number of Request Files submitted by the School per calendar year.
- 5. The services provided by the Clearinghouse under this Agreement will be paid for by the School through Naviance, which will be responsible for forwarding payment to the Clearinghouse.
- 6. The Clearinghouse uses its best efforts to review, interpret, and follow publicly disseminated guidance on FERPA in the development and operation of its services and provides for the release of only unblocked directory information unless FERPA authorizes release without consent. The School is solely responsible for its compliance with FERPA, and the Clearinghouse is not liable for any errors or omissions by the School that may give rise to FERPA violations. Both the Clearinghouse and the School agree to comply with all applicable Federal, State, and local statutes, regulations, and other requirements pertaining to the security, confidentiality, and privacy of information exchanged with and maintained by the Clearinghouse.
- 7. The School agrees that it may only disclose the data provided by the Clearinghouse to other educators, school boards, and school officials whom it has determined to have legitimate educational interests. The School agrees that it will not release data provided by the Clearinghouse to any other individuals, institutions, or organizations, other than those identified above, either in student or postsecondary institution identifiable form, without the Clearinghouse's express written permission and payment of any additional fees that may be required.
- 8. In the event the School is required to disclose any data provided hereunder (specifically including, but not limited to, information which could potentially identify individuals or specific postsecondary institutions) pursuant to any applicable statute, law, rule or regulation of any governmental authority or pursuant to any order of any court of competent jurisdiction, the School must provide the Clearinghouse prompt notice of such request for disclosure and reasonably cooperate with the Clearinghouse's efforts to obtain a protective order. The parties further agree that any exclusion effected pursuant to this provision is authorized only to the minimum extent necessary to allow the School to comply with a legal rule or order compelling the disclosure of information and shall not constitute a general waiver of the obligations of confidentiality under this Agreement.

The Clearinghouse will destroy all information provided under this Agreement after all retention requirements for federal, state and local audits have expired but in no event later than six months after termination of the Agreement.
- 12. The School agrees to acknowledge in all internal and external reports, presentations, publications, press releases, and/or research announcements that utilize StudentTracker data that the source of the data is the StudentTracker service from the National Student Clearinghouse.
- 13. The School agrees to provide all notices to the Clearinghouse under this Agreement to:

- 14. The Clearinghouse agrees to provide all notices under this Agreement to the School to the signatory and address on Page 1 of this Agreement unless otherwise instructed in writing by the School. The Clearinghouse considers the signatory to this Agreement as its primary contact for all operational and systems issues unless otherwise instructed in writing by the School.
- 15. This Agreement commences on the date that School access to the StudentTracker service is first enabled ("Effective Date") and shall continue until the earlier of: (a) termination by either party by providing sixty (60) days notice to the other party, or (b) termination of the School's relationship with Naviance. In the event of termination under (b) above, the School may enter into a direct contract with the Clearinghouse. The parties agree that any subsequent modifications to this Agreement will be made only in writing.
- 16. All representations, warranties, disclaimers of liabilities, indemnifications, and covenants between the parties will survive the termination of this Agreement for any reason and in any manner and will remain in full force and effect between the parties.
