



## WHAT ABOUT THE HIJAB?

I want to talk about hijabs and what it means to wear it. So, Hijabs means "veil" in Arabic. Women/girls that wear it are very modest. We Christians should be very close to Muslims as it says in the Bible to be so. We are like brothers and sisters with Muslims. Our Eastern Orthodox religion is so close in similarities: Muslims love and believe in Jesus as one of their most important prophets. But they do not believe he is the son of God. That's why they worship Allah.

Also, in the Holy Quran it says the same: to be close to Christians. That's why I love to wear the hijab. But soon, I'll start wearing more of a veil.

Now, I want to talk about Arabic words. Whenever I say mashallah, Inshallah, AstafaAllah, or Allah Akbar. People say I'm Muslim... No, I'm not! Then, they'll say, "Well, you said *Allah*!" *Allah* in Arabic means "God." So, when I say that, I'm referring to him. "Mashallah" means "God has willed it." "Inshallah" means "God wills it." "AstafaAllah" means "God forbid." And lastly, "Allah Arkbar" means "God is the greatest."

Arabic words don't just belong to Muslims!

When I tell people I grew up in America, but am originally from Iraq, people say. "No, you're just black!" Well yes, because I'm Afro-Iraqi Arab. Then, when I say my origin is from the middle east, people often say, "They are only Muslim countries!" Not so. In many countries in the "mideast" many, many people are Eastern Orthodox Christian! Like me!


