All vaccines are free of latex and preservatives. Those 65 years and older are eligible to receive a high dose (HD) vaccine while supplies last. If the HD vaccine is not available, the standard dose will be given.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

If I am wearing a mask and social distancing, do I still need to get a flu shot?

Yes. Wearing a mask and social distancing are important to help prevent the spread of infectious diseases – including both COVID-19 and the flu. However, they are not 100% effective. Getting a flu shot is the most powerful defense against flu.

Who should get a flu shot?

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommends that individuals 6 months and older be vaccinated each year.

Can the flu shot make me sick or give me the flu?

No. The flu shot is made from an inactivated virus that can't transmit infection. So people who get sick after receiving a flu vaccination were going to get sick anyway. It takes two weeks to get protection from the vaccine. But people assume that because they got sick after getting the vaccine, the flu shot caused their illness.

Does the flu vaccine contain the COVID-19 vaccine?

No. The flu vaccine only protects against the flu. There is no vaccine available for COVID-19.

WHAT TO EXPECT WHILE GETTING YOUR FLU SHOT

- Wait times may vary depending on volume. Thank you for your patience
- Everyone will be screened for COVID-19 symptoms
- All attendees over the age of 2 are required to wear a mask
- Everyone receiving a flu shot will be required to sign a medical consent form. People under the age of 18 will require a parent or guardian signature
- Please wear clothing that will allow access to the upper arm
- For drive-up events all recipients will remain in their vehicle
