Freshman Literature Distance Learning Week 3: April 20-26, 2020

Hello, Freshman Lit Students! This week, we continue with our third week of **Unit 2**, on **Love & Sacrifice.** Although we will not be following the original syllabus exactly, it is my hope that we can still use parts of our original mentor text, Romeo and Juliet by Shakespeare, along with supplementary texts to investigate the **essential questions**:

- What is love?
- What are the boundaries of love and sacrifice?
- How do relationships shape our values, actions, and lives?

Last week, we read a short article about how showing compassion can make you a physically healthier person. This week, we will be reading a poem "I Am Offering This Poem" by Jimmy Santiago Baca. You will complete comprehension questions about the text and answer a question for discussion.

You will also need to complete another Journal Entry Assignment, writing a journal entry and completing a prompt from the assignment grid like last week.

To complete this week's assignments, please do the following:

2. Read "I am Offering This Poem" by Baca (attached as a PDF to this post).

Be sure to include also include a journal response describing your feelings and experiences this week, in addition to the prompt. This assignment is now available as a Form to fill out in Teams, OR you may upload your assignment as an attached document. you may answer the questions using the Forms document. (You may also use Word/GoogleDocs to write it, then just copy and paste your answers into the form fields when you are finished.)
