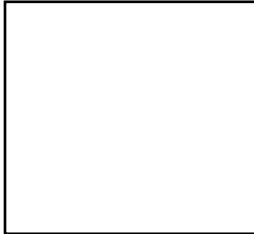


ESOL Choice Board for Grades 6-8

Start reading a good book! Click here to access a PDF of “The Lightning Thief” If “The Lightning Thief” is not for you, ask your ELA or ESOL teacher for a recommendation. They may even be able to lend you a book from their classroom library. Your school library and neighborhood library are also good options. How many pages can you read today? 	Read the first and second chapters of “The Lightning Thief,” or whatever book you picked up yesterday. After you read, select one character from your book, and “post” a Facebook status for them. After that, grab a sheet of paper and illustrate an important event in the text so far. Add a 3-5 sentence explanation of the importance of the event to the story. Keep this paper! You’ll need it tomorrow. 	Read the fifth and sixth chapters of “The Lightning Thief,” or whatever book you picked up on Monday. After that, grab your drawing from yesterday and jot down a prediction of what you think will happen in the next chapter. Try writing your prediction like this: <i>In chapter _____, I believe _____ will happen, because _____.</i>	Read the seventh and eighth chapters of “The Lightning Thief,” or whatever book you picked up on Monday. You should be well into your book by now. Pretend that you will have the opportunity to interview the author of your book for a podcast. Write down 4 questions you would ask them. Stumped how to start? Try this: <i>Which character _____?</i> <i>What event _____?</i> <i>When _____ was _____, how did you _____?</i> <i>Why did _____?</i>
