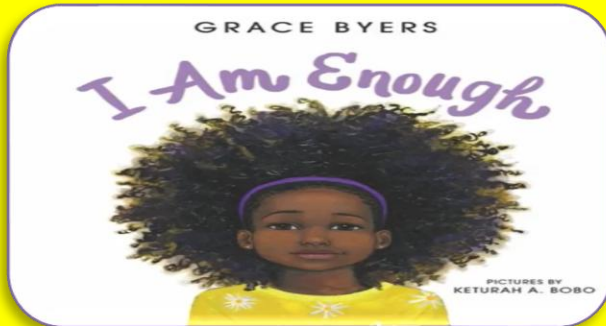




ESOL Choice Board: Pre-K
