Listening Activity

Click here to listen to the creative director of TIME for Kids, Drew, and his sidekick Rosie as they explore their imaginations and come up with fun things to sketch. In this episode, learn about giraffes and sketch along with Drew and Rosie.





What did you learn? "I learned a lot about giraffes. For example, they are the tallest mammals on Earth, and they have very long necks and legs. Giraffes also have unique, spotted coat patterns, and they only need to drink water once every few days."

Listening Activity

<u>Click here</u> to learn about the Chinese language. There are thousands of languages in the world, and Mandarin, a form of Chinese, is spoken by more people than any other language. Be sure to click the READ ALOUD link at the top of the page to listen to the article. What did you learn from the article?





What did you learn? 'I learned that the Chinese language does not use letters but characters or symbols, each with its own meaning. "Ni Hao" (nee how) means "hello," and "jia" (jee-ah) means "home" in Chinese.

Speaking Activity

<u>Click here</u> to visit the Smithsonian's National Zoo's website and explore the animal webcams. Observe the animals' habitats and consider these questions: What does the animal see? What are they doing? What might the animal think or feel? What might the animal care about? Discuss with a family member or friend.
