


# **ESOL Choice Board Grades 6-8**

### **Speaking Activity**


Remember, point of view is the perspective from which a story is told. Most stories are told in 1<sup>st</sup> person (using a character's own words and *I* or *We*) or 3<sup>rd</sup> person (about other characters and using *he, she,* or *they*).
