School Improvement Grants Awarded to 11 District Schools

The St. Louis Public School District was recently notified by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education that \$4.3 Million has been awarded to improve 11 schools in the District. The funds are part of the federal government's School Improvement Grant Program. This is the first year of three years of funding.

With the announcement of funding, SLPS can immediately begin implementing new initiatives outlined in the improvement plans for each school. Among the new initiatives are extending the school day, Saturday classes, reading improvement programs, additional social services and professional development opportunities for teachers.

SLPS schools receiving SIG funding are Vashon, Fanning, Langston, L'Ouverture, Ashland, Columbia, Hamilton, Jefferson, Mann, Sigel and Walbridge.

Cole Elementary Participates in BioBlitz 2010

Students from Cole Elementary recently had the exciting opportunity to participate in the 2010 BioBlitz – a 24-hour inventory of life in Forest Park led by the Academy of Science St. Louis. As part of the event's opening ceremony, students had a special chance to meet St. Louis Mayor Francis Slay and hear from several notable St. Louis leaders involved with the BioBlitz event.

This special event kicked off the second year of the Saint Louis Art Museum's partnership with Cole Elementary School. This program brings
