John Locke was an English philosopher who developed the concept of natural rights. He believed that all people have the natural right to life, liberty and property.

Life: People want to survive and to be safe from threats.

Property: People want to own the things that are necessary to survive such as houses, food, tools, or land.

Locke called life, liberty and property our natural rights. Natural rights are the rights people have from birth.
