DEFINITION:

 the fact of including many different types of people or things

- The school prides itself on its ethnic **diversity**.
- The **diversity** of their merchandise is better than other stores.

DEFINITION:

 the length of time that something continues

- The doctors asked Betty about the duration and frequency of her headaches.
- Several new workers were hired for the duration of the project.







The doctors asked Betty about the **duration** and frequency of her headaches.



Several new workers were hired for the **duration** of the project.





sufficient

DEFINITION:

as much as needed for a particular purpose

- Students must reach a sufficiently high standard to pass.
- The recipe is **sufficient** for six people.
- The insurance money will be **sufficient** to pay for all the repairs.

The recipe is **sufficient** for five people.







The insurance money will be **sufficient** to pay for all the repairs.

compensation

DEFINITION:

- money paid to someone because they have suffered injury or loss, or because something they own has been damaged;
- something that makes a bad situation better

- Betty received **compensation** from her insurance company when her house was destroyed by the tornado.
- The workers were given 30 days' pay as **compensation**.
