IB HoA II IA Section 1 Assignment

The final draft of the complete IA must be turned in as a printed-out hard copy <u>and</u> must be uploaded to TurnItIn.com by the beginning of class on Thursday, 3/8.

Make sure all of the following are correct before turning in the final draft:

Add a title page with your research question and total word count.
Do NOT include your name on your paper anywhere.
All comments or mistakes from the all previous drafts are fixed or addressed.
The font is 12 pt. Times New Roman, 12 pt. Garamond, or 11 pt. Georgia.
There are page numbers in the same font style as the body of the paper.
It is double spaced.
There are no extra blank lines between paragraphs.
There is no first or second person used (except in the reflection).
There are no sentences starting with conjunctions (including the word "however").
At the beginning of the paper is "Question:" in bold, followed by your research question and a blank
line.
After the question is "Section 1: Identification and evaluation of sources" in bold.
Your first paragraph should start with a dramatic setup explaining your topic and drawing your reader
in, then should restate the question in the last sentence.
Section 1 must identify the two main sources selected for detailed analysis, should explain what they
are, and should explain their relevance to the investigation.
With reference to the origins, purpose and content, you should analyze the value and limitations of the
two sources in relation to the investigation.
At the end of each section, on its own line, give a section word count in parentheses.
After section 1 and the section word count is a blank line followed by "Section 2: Investigation" in bold
Section 2 contains all of the facts that are relevant to your question from all of your sources and critical
analysis of those facts.
Section 2 includes a conclusion that answers your initial question.
After section 2 and the section word count is a blank line followed by "Section 3: Reflection" in bold.
Section 3 contains a reflection on what you've learned about writing history and the methods used by
historians and the challenges of writing history and must connect explicitly to your research question.
Any citations are Chicago Style footnotes, not parenthetical citations.
All superscript footnote numbers are at the end of a sentence after the final punctuation.
Footnotes are in the same font style as the body of the paper, but in 10 pt. size, including the numbers.
Footnotes are formatted and punctuated correctly.
Footnotes are single-spaced with the first line of each footnote indented five spaces (indentation comes
before the number) and no blank lines between entries.
The bibliography is on its own page with the word "Bibliography" centered in bold at the top.
The bibliography is made up of correctly formatted Chicago style bibliography entries.
Bibliography entries that take more than one line should be single-spaced within the entry, but with a
blank line between each entry.
All book titles are italicized, article titles are in quotes, and neither is underlined.
URLs should not be blue or underlined.

If any of the above checklist are not followed, it will affect your grade.
