Do I need teaching experience?

No. Your enthusiasm, patience and compassion are far more important. Your roles as a tutor are those of a friend and a role model.

What age are the children?

The program is designed for children in kindergarten through fourth grade, a critical period for developing reading and language skills.

Where and when will I tutor?

You will work in a school right in your neighborhood. Your student's teacher will help you find a time during the school day for your weekly sessions.

What training will I receive?

Tutors complete an in-depth training based on a proven six-part plan of activities. You'll learn ways to draw out the child's experiences and create simple stories that form the basis for reading activities.

You are encouraged to also attend tutor meetings for continued training and the chance to share your successes and challenges with other tutors.

Through the OASIS Intergenerational Tutoring program, volunteers, your neighborhood schools and OASIS work together to help children build reading skills, self-esteem and positive attitudes toward learning. Training and materials are provided; no teaching experience is needed.

How do I become a tutor?

You begin by completing the tutor training program provided by your local school. Then you commit to meeting with a student each week.

You will work with the same child througout the school year. Of course,
