Greetings students and families,

Beginning in 7th grade, we empower our scholars to emerge as a collective of lifelong leaders in service of powerful change by providing them with preparation for, access to, and support throughout a transformative educational journey. We:

- Recruit high performing, high potential, underserved students from St. Louis Public and charter middle schools, and prepare them for a rigorous high school education
- · Provide scholars with access to top college preparatory high schools
- Support scholars in realizing ongoing academic success in high school
- Support scholars in applying to, selecting, and succeeding in a four-year college of their choice
- Empower scholars to emerge as leaders in their high schools and communities

We work with more than 100 scholars, who attend the region's top college-prep high schools, including Metro, Collegiate, MICDS, St. Louis University High School, and Villa Duchesne, among others. Scholars are incredibly diverse and identify as African-American, Caucasian, Asian, Hispanic, and immigrant as well as other races and ethnicities. 86% received free or reduced lunch during middle school and are projected to be the first generation in their family to complete a four-year college education. With our support, scholars have maintained a solid B grade point average at their rigorous college preparatory high schools, have secured over \$1 million in scholarships and financial aid (over four school years) to fund their tuition-based high school education, and are emerging as change agents in their schools and communities.

The scholars, families, team, placement schools, and community partners who work with inspireSTL are collectively driving towards improving St. Louis. All members of our team are committed to the core values of knowledge, character, community, vision, and leadership, and we seek to recruit scholars and families who will positively contribute to our mission and embody these values. Beyond the core values, the pursuit of excellence is a non-negotiable, and we hold all members of the program accountable to this standard. We look forward to the Class of 2020 inspireSTL scholars joining us and preparing to emerge as transformative leaders in their schools and communities!

Selection Criteria

- Student must currently be in 7th grade, must be a resident of St. Louis City, and must attend a St. Louis Public or charter school in St. Louis City
- Two teacher recommendations that indicate the student is diligent, hardworking, and of high character
- Strong academic performance preferably 6th and 7th grade GPA of at least 3.2
- Strong performance on MAP tests preferably Proficient or Advanced in both Math and Communication Arts

Program Expectations Upon Acceptance

Please evaluate whether you and your family are willing to commit to the following as you are applying to join the inspireSTL community:

- Embodiment of the core values of knowledge, character, vision, community, and leadership
- Attendance at all mandatory events, such as Induction Ceremony and various orientations
- Consistent attendance to all Academic Preparation classes (14 months: Two intensive eight week Summer Terms, each five days per week, before 8th and 9th grade, and throughout the entire intervening school year, twice per week)
- Steady mastery of academic content and completion of homework throughout the 14-month Academic Preparation Program
- Open, honest, and consistent communication with the inspireSTL team
- Commitment to the program from middle school through college completion
- A commitment to pursue leadership in and out of school

Application Process and Timeline

- **1. February 17, 2014** All application materials are due
- 2. **March 6, 2014** All applicants will be notified of their status and finalists will be invited to interview
- 3. Third and fourth weeks of March 2014 Finalist Interviews held
- 4. **April 17, 2015 –** Finalists will be notified of their status
- 5. June 1, 2015 Prep Academy begins for all Class of 2020 scholars
