■ What happens next?

- Next, a confirmation receipt will be mailed to your home.
- Application received by Recruitment & Counseling and time-stamped before being entered into database
 - Gifted applications <u>MUST</u> be turned in between September 1 and October 15th to be eligible for lottery
- Priority Assigned
- Application delivered to Gifted & Talented
- Application Screened
- Forms Mailed to Families
 - Once testing forms have been returned to Gifted & Talented then:

■ What is the Lottery?

- When we receive your application, it will be entered into our computer system and be assigned to its appropriate priority category. The computer then randomly assigns an identification number to the application when the sorting lottery is held.
- Because the number of applications for <u>specific schools and grade levels</u> exceeds the number of available spaces, all applications are entered into a lottery. The lottery assures an equal chance for all students applying to magnet schools, within certain priority categories.
