Here are some important updates:

- Thanksgiving Break will be from November 23 through November 27.
- If you have not had a chance to read the Superintendent's Bulletin, here is what you should know:
 - To help limit the spread of COVID-19 in our schools, the week following Thanksgiving (November 30-December 4) all district schools will be closed to students. All instruction will be virtual.
 - Our bell time will be the same (9:10am-3:07pm); teachers will continue to teach with their current schedules.
 - In-person instruction will resume on December 7, 2020.
- No School on December 18 as it is Record Keeping Day.
- Winter Break will be from December 21-January 1.
- Please note that the school playground is closed as we do our part to stop the spread of COVID. We ask that you do not allow your children to play on the playground after school. Your cooperation is appreciated.
- As a reminder, we are not able to accept any shared items from home unless they are for your individual child.
- Operation Food Search is happening! If you have canned goods that you would like to drop off, there will be a barrel outside during morning pickup—and more at the entrance to Door #3. There will also be a barrel at Door #5 for those who wish to drop off during afternoon pick up! The last day will be January 7, 2021.

As students will be virtual after Thanksgiving break, I ask that you take an inventory of what is working for your child in the virtual classroom as we continue to keep them engaged with the task at hand. Here are some tips:

- Evaluate your child's learning environment at home.
- Make sure the learning area is free from distractions.
- Maintain a daily and/or weekly task list.
- Have a copy of the schedule handy!
