Mr. Mike Phoenix, Lyon Computer Literacy Teacher; Mr. Jerome Bollato, Clinical Educator at the University of Missouri at St. Louis; Mr. Jarret Smith, SLPS Instructional Facilitator for Superintendent Adams' school cluster; and Mr. Phillip Boyd, Assistant Superintendent of Support and Innovation, Jennings School District.

What do these four educators have in common? They are all graduate students at the University of Missouri at St. Louis, working towards their doctorates in Education. Last August they enrolled in a course entitled "Building Socially Just Educational Communities." Students had to develop a semesterlong project; Mr. Phoenix's team decided to present some of the things they had been learning in their class to the faculty and students at Lyon. With the permission of Dr. Iskali and Mr. Archer, the Social Justice 4 Team presented the topic to staff during a faculty meeting on November 17, 2014. Two days later, with the support of Ms. Fulton, Lyon Academy Counselor, the team presented a lesson on social justice to 7th Grade Students in Mr. Phoenix's Computer Literacy Class. Mr. Smith presented a photo activity, where students matched a picture of a person to a career. This got students thinking and talk-

ing about stereotypes and the judgments people often make based on the way people appear. Next, the Team introduced some the controversial concepts of Social Justice and systems of privilege and oppression. The team had created a board game based on the classic Game of Life, but this was the "Privileged and Oppressed Edition!"
