


Ms. Harringa's third grade class pauses for lunch during a field trip to the Children's Magic House in Kirkwood, Missouri.



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
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Skills checklist. 3rd graders check off new skills gained in graphics software while 7th graders (left and top right) chart math and science data using Microsoft Excel.
