

L'INFINITIF APRÈS CERTAINES EXPRESSIONS

VERBE + INFINITIF

After another **verb** that is **conjugated**, use the **INFINITIVE** (the **unconjugated form of the verb ending in - er, -ir, or -re**)

Je **devrais manger** des produits bio.
I should eat organic produce.

Tu **aimes faire** de l'exercice?
Do you like to exercise?

NOTE: “TO” that is part of the infinitive in English, **is not always there.**

I should eat organic food.

POUR + INFINITIF

After the word **POUR** = **(IN ORDER) TO**

Je fais de l'exercice **pour être** en bonne santé.
I exercise (in order) to stay healthy.

Elle prend son temps **pour bien digérer.**
She takes her time (in order) to digest well.

NOTE: “IN ORDER” is not needed in English. To use “POUR + infinitive” in French, always replace “TO” by “IN ORDER TO” in English.

DE + INFINITIF

After certain expressions followed by the preposition **DE/D'**.

éviter de: to avoid
conseiller de : to advise
essayer de: to try
choisir de: to choose

Il est important de: it's important
Le plus important, c'est de: the most important thing is

Je te **conseille de consommer** moins de sucre.
I advise you to consume less sugar.

Il est important d'éviter le fast-food.
It's important to avoid fastfood.

After certain expressions followed by the preposition **à**:

Je pense à faire mes devoirs.
