

## QUI + VERB = THAT / WHICH / WHO

QUI is a connector that you can use to create a longer sentence. Use QUI when the word that comes next is a verb.

C'est un bénévole qui est compréhensif.

He's a volunteer who is understanding.

C'est un organisme qui aide les personnes âgées.

This is an organization that helps elders.

## OÙ = WHERE OR WHAT

QUE is a connector that you can use to create a longer sentence. Use OÙ when you want to give more information about a place or a time within the same sentence.

C'est l'hôpital où je fais du bénévolat.

It's the hospital where I volunteer.

C'est l'heure où nous commençons à travailler.

It's the time when we start to work.

## QUE / QU' + SUBJECT = THAT / WHICH / WHOM

QUE is a connector that you can use to create a longer sentence. Use QUE or QU' when the word that comes next is a subject.

C'est une tâche que M. Gassama fait bien.

It's a task (that) Mr Gassama does well.

C'est un projet qu'elles lancent au mois de décembre.

It's a project (that) they'll launch in December.

Note the parentheses around "that" in the English translation: THAT is not necessary in English, but QUE is in French.

It's a project they'll launch in December.

## REMEMBER

Don't mistake the question words with the relative pronouns

QUESTION WORDS RELATIVE PRONOUNS
QUI = WHO QUI = THAT / WHICH / WHOM
QUE = WHAT QUE = THAT / WHICH / WHOM
OÙ = WHERE / WHEN
