

## Le futur simple 182-83

1. To form the future tense in French, you add the future endings to the entire infinitive of verbs that end in **-er** or **-ir**. You drop the **-e** before adding the endings to **-re** verbs. Study the following.

Infinitif	parler	finir	attendre
Racine	parler	finir	attendr
Conjugaison	je parlerai tu parleras il parlera nous parlerons vous parlerez ils parleront	je finirai tu finiras il finira nous finirons vous finirez ils finiront	j'attendrai tu attendras il attendra nous attendrons vous attendrez ils attendront

2. Several verbs have irregular stems in the future tense, but the same regular endings:

être - ser	voir - verr	pouvoir - pourr	devoir - devr
faire - fer	envoyer - enverr	vouloir - voudr	recevoir - recevr
aller - ir	venir - viendr	savoir - saur	yer - ier
avoir - aur	mourir - mourr	falloir - faudr	eCer - èCer

3. The future tense is not commonly used in spoken French. You use *aller* + the infinitive more often to express the future. However, **you must use the future tense after quand when the main verb in the sentence is in the future tense.**

Je te **ferai** un bon repas **quand** tu **seras** à Paris.  
**Quand** tout le monde **sera** là, je **mettrai** la viande au four.

Traduis:

I will make a pie.  
 You will see, everything will be alright.  
 He hopes you will go to France.  
 When we grow up, we will travel.  
 You all will be able to speak fluently soon.  
 They will have to be careful.  
 We will have a good semester.  
 I will know the answer after I open my book.  
 She will come tonight.
