Describe activities:

Saint Louis Public Schools offers professional development at the beginning of the year for all staff as well as focused school-level development. Virtual PD options including data literacy, dyslexia training, and other booster sessions are offered throughout the school year. Job-embedded professional learning is led by consultants to support focused initiatives based on our Saint Louis Public Schools Student Success Goals. In addition, staff can attend conferences, workshops, mandatory trainings as required by the state and other necessary development opportunities throughout the year. Summer professional development opportunities are provided to staff and ongoing support offered across all content areas, are provided year-round (virtual and face-to-face). These Professional Development opportunities are documented in the Frontline Professional Learning and Growth Management System. Professional learning committees meet throughout the school year to inform school-level, district, and leader development throughout the year. These activities will be aligned with the Missouri Learning Standards.

Describe alignment activities: School-level (site-based) professional learning supports teachers and leaders in unpacking the Missouri Learning Standards. School leaders are expected to submit their site-based professional learning plans to the Professional Development Department. Structures have been created in our system to support common planning times for grade-alike teammates to analyze student work and plan instruction that leverages our curricular resources to support the MLS. We provide in-person and virtual learning. Our Special Education, ESOL, Early Childhood, and CTE offices offer specific development opportunities around meeting the needs of all learners and the standards aligned to the students and teachers they support. Saint Louis Public School Curriculum Specialists support lesson plan writing and curricular resource work groups that receive training to provide teaching staff with resources directly aligned to Missouri Learning Standards.

SYSTEMS OF PROFESSIONAL GROWTH AND IMPROVEMENT

The LEA has systems of professional growth and improvement (e.g. induction for teachers, principals, or other school leaders and opportunities for building the capacity of teachers and opportunities to develop meaningful teacher leadership).

Describe systems of professional growth and improvement:

The district offers specific support for new teachers as well as a mentoring program. The Missouri Teacher Development System (MTDS) provides targeted professional development to our teachers through the Beginning Teacher Assistance Program throughout the school year. Principals and school leaders engage in monthly professional development through their monthly principal meetings. All staff engage in days of Districtwide PD throughout the year. A variety of topics are covered to ensure meaningful development. Leaders engage in an Instructional Leadership Institute to provide tailored professional learning aligned with district priorities. We utilize a PD management system (Frontline) to track engagement and outcomes of learning and growth opportunities aligned to classroom observation and feedback. In addition, our system supports a leadership development program which support leaders and aspiring leaders who may need additional growth and development to be most successful in their context.

Title II.A funds will be used to support the development of our instructional staff to reach our CSIP goals. The district hosted Title II.A consultation meetings to share how PD funds are spent as well as gain feedback on appropriate use and recommendations.
