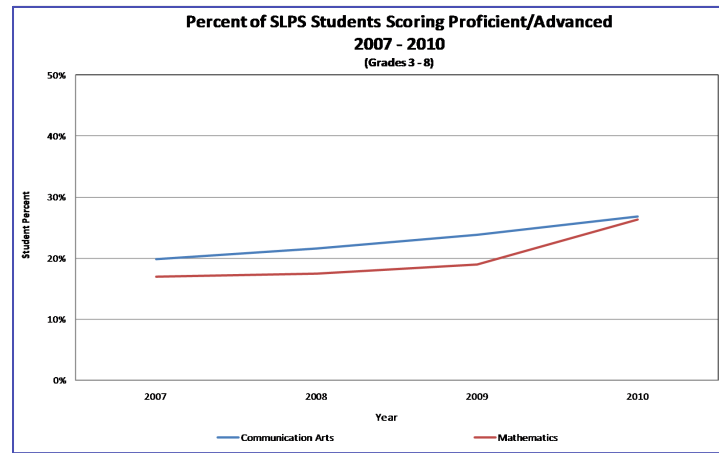
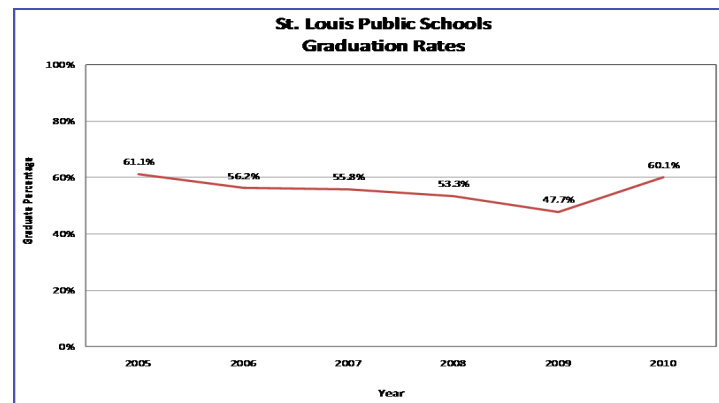


## SLPS Data Charts

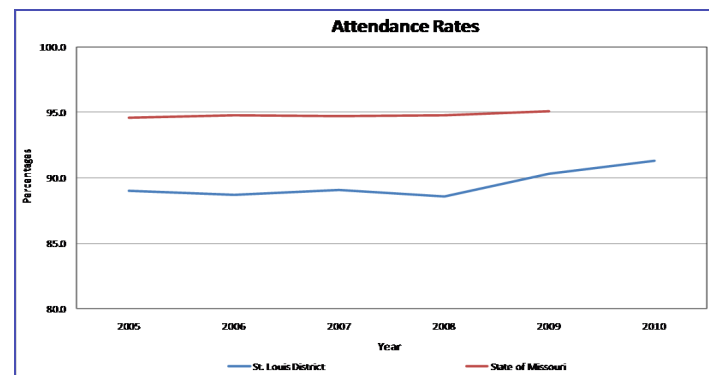
Since 2007 there has been an increase in SLPS students achieving proficient or advanced status in Communication Arts and Mathematics.



The 2010 graduation rate is 60%, the highest since 2005. More importantly, more seniors are applying for higher education opportunities after graduation. SLPS seniors who graduated in 2009 & 2010 earned over \$75 million in scholarships and grants.



Attendance has risen, but remains an area of concern for SLPS. Increasing attendance has proven to raise the graduation rate and improve test scores in reading and math comprehension. Attendance also impacts the number of faculty/staff hired and which school buildings remain in operation.

## Major SLPS Gains in Academics

According to the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education's 2010 **Annual Performance Report (APR)**, SLPS earned 5 accreditation points, out of a possible 14 points, an increase from 3 points in 2009. The categories in which points were earned include:

- ◆ Advanced Courses
- ◆ Career Education Courses
- ◆ College Placement
- ◆ Career Education Placement
- ◆ Bonus MAP Achievement

**Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP)** is a measure of school performance according to the federal No Child Left Behind Act. Twelve (16%) district schools earned AYP status in 2010. In previous years less than 15% of district schools achieved this status.

The **Missouri Assessment Program (MAP)** is an annual set of standardized tests taken by all Missouri students. Students in grades 3-8 are tested in Communication Arts and Mathematics. Additionally, the assessment includes **End Of Course (EOC)** exams for grades 9-12 in Algebra I, Biology, English II and American Government.

**In 2010, 40 SLPS schools showed improvement in MAP Communication Arts and Mathematics exams.**

#### 2010 MAP Communication Arts Data:

- ◆ 19 schools made AYP status in Communication Arts
- ◆ 47 schools showed improvement in Communication Arts from 08/09 to 09/10
- ◆ 9 high schools showed improvement on the EOC exams in Communication Arts

#### 2010 MAP Mathematics Data:

- ◆ 23 schools made AYP Status in Mathematics
- ◆ 54 schools showed improvement in Mathematics from 08/09 to 09/10
- ◆ 7 high schools showed improvement on the EOC exams in Mathematics
