History of Red Ribbon Week

Red Ribbon week was inspired by the life and work of Drug Enforcement Agency Special Agent Enrique "Kiki" Camerena. After graduating from college and serving in the Marines and as a police officer, he joined the DEA so he could help fight illegal drugs. While working undercover in Mexico, he was killed by drug traffickers. The people in his hometown in California began wearing red ribbons to commemorate his life. The trend took hold throughout the country and in 1988, Congress officially proclaimed "Red Ribbon Week".

Medication and Medical Information:





Medical:

- If your child has any medical conditions, please provide this information to me with a note from your child's pediatrician explaining the disease process and care that may be needed for your child.
- If you would like me to be able to share information with your doctor and allow your child's doctor to share information with me, it is imperative for you to sign an authorization to release information for this school year.
- If your child has allergies or seizures, please provide me with a copy of their allergy plan, or seizure plan signed by their pediatrician that is less than one calendar year old.
- If your child has asthma, please bring your child's inhaler in the original box, along with their asthma action plan, signed by their pediatrician that is less than one calendar year old, and an authorization form.
- ♦ There is a free asthma program offered at the school. It is called Healthy Kids Express. Please stop by my office or call me for a permission packet.



Medication:

- If your child has any medications that need to be taken at school, please provide me with that medication as well as a signed Authorization to Administer letter. This letter needs to be signed by yourself and the child's pediatrician.
- If your child is in need of an over-the-counter medication, I cannot give it to them, unless I have written permission. I have a specific form for this situation in my office.


