- (06-08-21-57) To approve a contract renewal with Softchoice, the direct partner and provides the sale of the entire Microsoft Product Suite and anti-virus protection to each of our computers in the District for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 at a cost not to exceed \$490,000, pending funding availability. Increased cost represents an upgrade in anti-virus software that protects both on and off-site vulnerability. Additionally, it includes upgrades to other new apps delivered for the virtual teaching delivery method. The cost is not to exceed \$500,000, pending funding availability. The current environment was placed into production in 2012, with a small refresh in 2016. (06-08-21-80) To approve the sole source purchase of service with Metro Transit to provide bus passes and tickets to the eligible elementary, middle, and high school students requiring public transportation services for the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, at a cost not to exceed \$488,150.00, pending budget availability. This purchase supports Pillar 1: A System of Excellent Schools; Goal 1A: Student Attendance.

(06-08-21-81) To approve a contract renewal with Advance Security and technology to provide daily security monitoring and investigative alarm services for all District schools and buildings, for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 at a cost not to exceed \$190,000.00, pending funding availability. The renewal will cover the third year of the three-year renewal option. The contract supports Pillar 1: A System of Excellent Schools, Goal 1B: Safe & Secure Schools.

(06-08-21-82) To approve the purchase of Safety and Security uniforms and other related safety supplies from Leon Uniforms for the 2021-2022 school year, at a cost not to exceed \$31,000.00, pending funding availability. This service supports Pillar 1: A System of Excellent Schools, Goal 1B: Safe & Secure Schools.

(06-08-21-83) To approve a contract renewal for the listing agreement with Development Resource Partners, LLC to provide District real estate services, including standard brokerage services with a 6% real estate commission, for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, pending funding availability. The only cost to the District will be when a property is sold. The 6% commissions are paid from the proceeds of the sales. The renewal will cover the second year of the contract. The contract supports Pillar 1: A System of Excellent Schools, Goal 1C: Financial Sustainability.

(06-08-21-84) To approve a contract renewal with Engineered Fire Protection to provide inspections and repair services for fire sprinklers and associated backflow preventers in all District schools and buildings, for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 at a cost not to exceed \$70,605.00, pending funding availability. This renewal covers the second year of the three-year renewal options. The contract supports Pillar 1: A System of Excellent Schools, Goal 1B: Safe & Secure Schools.

(06-08-21-85) To approve a contract renewal with Republic Services to provide solid waste management services in selected District schools and buildings for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 at a cost not to exceed \$291,557.57, pending funding availability. This renewal covers the first year of the three-year renewal option. The contract supports Pillar 1: A System of Excellent Schools, Goal 1B: Safe & Secure Schools.

(06-08-21-86) To approve a contract renewal with Cintas Fire Protection Company to provide fire alarm testing and inspection services for all District schools and buildings for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 at a cost not to exceed \$62,166.00, pending funding availability. The renewal will cover the third year of the three-year renewal option. The contract supports Pillar 1: A System of Excellent Schools, Goal 1B: Safe & Secure Schools.

(06-08-21-87) To approve a contract renewal with Tremco/WTI to provide roof inspection, maintenance, repair, and replacement services for all District schools and buildings, for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, at a cost not to exceed \$1,500,000.00, pending funding availability. This renewal covers the first year of the three-year renewal options. The contract supports Pillar 1: A System of Excellent Schools, Goal 1B: Safe & Secure Schools.

(06-08-21-88) To ratify and approve a renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Roosevelt Community Council (RCC) for the use of Roosevelt High School and to provide approximately six to nine District teachers to carry out the City of St. Louis' Youth at Risk Crime Prevention Program (program). Ratification is necessary because grant funding was approved as the program was set to begin. This afterschool program is grant funded by the same City program. District teachers will receive extra pay via the grant dollars paid to the District. The 2020-21 school year is the second year of a two-year grant, January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2021, pending funding availability for year two. The St. Louis Public Schools Foundation acts as the fiscal agent under the grant. The RCC partnership supports the District's Transformation Plan 3.0 goals, Pillar 2: Fairness Equity Across System, Goal 2D: Partner with Community Allies and Pillar 5: Community Partner Resources, Goal 5C: Community and District Pride.

(06-08-21-89) To approve a contract with Satchel Pulse to provide a two-way community engagement service to gather, feedback, track and report information to and from stakeholders, including District families and staff from all schools, for the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 at a cost not to exceed \$24,750. This is the first year of the contract with a one-year renewal option. The service supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1A: Student Attendance, and Pillar 5: Community Partnerships/Resources, Goal 1B: Community and District Pride.

(06-08-21-90) To approve the marketing expenses of the Saint Louis Public Schools (i.e., television, radio, newspaper, billboards, bus shelters, print ads, yard signs, door hangers, media buying, and social media) for the 2021-2022 school year at a cost not to exceed \$300,000. Pillar 5: Community Partnerships Resources, Goal 5C: Community and District Pride.

PRESENTATIONS

Mr. Steven Carroll, the SLPS Lobbyist, gave a summary of the results of the most recent Missouri Legislative Session that ended June 4, 2021.

Dr. Adams presented the Human Resources, Curriculum Audit, and Board Policy Updates.

Dr. Adams gave a snapshot of the ESSER Fund Survey results. The survey closed on June 4, 2021. A detailed report will be provided at the next Board meeting.

SLPS will hold a vaccination event for district students ages 12 and over at Vashon High School Saturday, June 5, 2021(Pfizer Two-Dose COVID-19 Vaccine). The second vaccine doses are scheduled for Saturday, June 26, 2021. A parent or guardian must accompany children aged 12-15 to the event. SLPS will provide bus transportation. Sign-up indicates a place for students to request transportation. Once all information is collected, SLPS will draft a pick-up schedule and distribute it to families. SLPS will send reminders for the second dose the week of June 21, 2021. In addition, SLPS will provide recommended facilities to receive the vaccination for students that cannot receive the second dose.
