WHY AN ELA TEXTBOOK ADOPTION?

- ☐ Transformation Plan Goal: All Students Learn to Read and Succeed
 - √ 4.1 By the end of each school year, 80% of students will demonstrate a
 minimum of one year's growth in reading
 - √ 4.3 By the end of the 2021 school year, 80% of third graders will be reading on grade level
- ☐ DESE recommends a system-wide, evidence-based approach to literacy
- ☐ Convergent research in best-practice for literacy instruction for urban students supports the use of a system-wide, evidence-based literacy
- ☐ The SLPS Reading Plan recommends the following:
 - ✓ Equitable access to rigorous literacy instruction and materials
 - ✓ Implementation of a scientific and systematic approach to teaching literacy
 - ✓ Developing a coherent understanding of how to teach and assess literacy
 - ✓ Standards Based ELA Curriculum and Aligned Assessments
- ☐ SLPS has a Board-approved 5-year textbook adoption cycle
- ☐ There has been no formal ELA textbook adoption since 2009
- ☐ In 2015, SLPS began to use Engage New York resources for ELA instruction

2020 READING PILOT DATA COMPARISION



	In preparation for an ELA textbook adoption in 2020, a reading program pilot was approved for
	implementation in the 2019-20 School Year
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- SAVVAS was piloted at 2 Elementary Schools
- After only three months, preliminary results proved promising for our students in comparison with the average growth of students in 23 elementary schools across the District using Engage NY:

- □ 100% of Kindergarten students who participated in the program were able to move from the early literacy assessment to the STAR reading assessment by the end of the pilot period
- ☐ Textbook Adoption committees were convened in 2020 and 2021 to recommend a Reading/Literacy Program
- ☐ Savvas was selected as a top program by both committees for grades K-5 and grades 6-8 in 2021
