### **COVID TRANSMISSION**

In October, created a trained in-house Contact Tracing Team of 6 to immediately
investigate all exposures and positive cases to assess necessary quarantines, and to
track COVID symptom cases until the individual is cleared to return to school, for all
students and staff across the entire District.

- ☐ This includes virtual and in-person students and staff, so that we can track how COVID-19 is affecting our entire school community.
- ☐ We rely upon reports from staff, administrators, students, parents, community members, and Departments of Health, and track and assign a contact tracer to every single case that is reported.
- We work closely with the Department of Health on this process. When we assess any quarantines are needed, we report those individuals to the Department of Health, which monitors directly with the quarantined staff member or parent, to track whether or not the individual develops any symptoms during quarantine. We have seen tremendous success in infection control, which means that in-school safety protocol is working.
- ☐ We adhere to strict quarantine guidelines in the cases of all close contacts (within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more) to ensure that in the very few cases where we do see transmission, that those individuals are strictly quarantined so that no further transmission occurs.



### **COVID TRANSMISSION**

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	Quarantined almost 400 staff members, over half of which were quarantined due to an external,
	non-school exposure to a COVID positive person.
	School-related close contacts, we have a total of 6 staff COVID cases which are reasonably
	believed to be transmitted because of a school-related contact. Details of those are below:
	☐ Student to Staff: <b>3</b> (all outside of classroom: one student to nurse, one player to coach,
	one physical contact with student outside of classroom)
	☐ Staff to Staff: <b>3</b>
All	of these staff members have recovered and are back at school.

In total reported to the District, there have been approximately 130 students who have tested positive for COVID, almost half of which are virtual students. Again, 19 of those cases we reasonably believe are related to either school or sports exposure.
