STUDENT/STAFF RECOGNITIONS

The Class of 2022 donned their caps and gowns and took to the stage last month. This year's class exemplifies not only scholastic excellence but perseverance and resolve as well. Most were live streamed and available on YouTube, so if you want to see what this work is all about, please watch a few minutes of these inspiring ceremonies. Preliminary data from our College and Career Readiness team shows that more than 300 of our graduates have earned over \$50 million in merit-based scholarships (nearly identical to a year ago). Graduates will be continuing their education in 36 states and three foreign countries (Ireland, Poland, and Spain) and enlisting in every branch of the military. Additionally, our data pinpoints 165 locations where our Class of '22 graduates have or are currently apprenticing, interning, or working. This is a summary of the scholarships reported SO FAR. Historically, we will continue to receive additional reports from our students over the next month and will continue to update through the summer.

(06-14-22-01) To approve contracts with Annie Malone, Logos, and Great Circle to provide private placement services for Special Education students for the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$1,600,000.00, pending funding availability. These contracts include two one-year renewal options. This service supports Pillar 1: System to Excellent Schools, Goal 1B Safe and Secure Schools.

(06-14-22-02) To approve contract agreements with Supplemental Healthcare, Chesapeake Medical, Presence Learning, The Stepping Stones Group, AMN Healthcare, Dot. Com Therapy, E Therapy, and EDU Healthcare to provide School Nurses, Special Education services to students with disabilities as identified by their Individual Education Program (IEP) and support services for students with specified support as indicated in the 504 Plan for the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$7,000,000, annually. These contracts include two one-year renewal options. This service supports Pillar 2: Fairness and Equity Across System, Goal 2D: SLPS will increase partnership effectiveness to provide school services. RFP:027-212

(06-14-22-03) To approve a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with St. Louis Community Credit Union (STLCCU). The credit union has a long history of involvement with SLPS as its roots are the St. Louis Teachers Credit Union. The MOU covers the work STLCC will undertake in our Full-Service schools (Vashon, Yeatman, Oak Hill, Walbridge) if the District successfully secures a Federal grant to expand programs for students and parents. STLCC will conduct 4-5 financial literacy sessions annually for five years of the grant. 1 – Excellent Schools, goal 1C: Financial stability. Pillar 5 – Community Partnerships Resources, 5C: community and District pride.

(06-14-22-04) To ratify a contract for services rendered by Building Futures Design & Build Workshops not to exceed \$42,800. Their work is at AESM and Compton-Drew. The students are reacting positively to the opportunity of hands-on design and building projects. This STEAM program has been well received by building leadership and faculty as well. 1 – Excellent Schools, goal 1A: student attendance. Pillar 5 – Community Partnerships Resources, 5C: community and District pride.

(06-14-22-05) To approve the renewal contract with Edmentum for the respective period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$500,000.00, to provide virtual learning services to homebound, full-time, and part-time students. Virtual services are available to students in grades K-12. This is the final year of a three-year agreement. This request supports Pillar 1: EXCELLENT SCHOOLS; from the District's Transformation Plan 3.0.

(06-14-22-06) To approve a contract renewal with TSI, Inc. to provide support and maintenance system for the period July 1, 2022, through July 31, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$410,000, pending funding availability. This is an ongoing contract due to the support needed with the Mitel product and its software alignment. This service supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools and Goal 1C: Financial Sustainability.

(06-14-22-07) To approve a sole source purchase from Data Recognition Corporation (DRC), as mandated by the State of Missouri, for the Grade Level Assessment (MAP GLA) tests as scheduled on the District's testing calendar. The cost includes purchasing tests, scoring, and reporting services for the 2022-2023 school year, at a cost not to exceed \$30,000, pending funding availability. This purchase will also assist in fulfilling Pillars 1 and 4 of the transformation plan: the District creates a system of excellent schools, and all students learn to read and succeed.

(06-14-22-08) To approve a contract renewal with RackSpace to provide maintenance and software support on our SAP application software for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$81,000, pending funding availability. This is an ongoing contract that provides continuous support with the SAP system. This service supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1C: Financial Sustainability.

(06-14-22-09) To approve a contract renewal with Dell Corporation as the standard vendor for technology purchases such as laptops, desktops, tablet computers, servers, storage devices, management software, and peripherals for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$5,000,000.00, pending funding availability. During the 2022-23 school year, this project will be rebid. This service supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1C: Financial Sustainability.

(06-14-22-10) To approve the renewal of an Agency Agreement with Saint Louis University for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, to assign at least two (2), but no more than three (3) Post-Doctorate Fellows to provide no less than sixty (60) hours per week in support of the District's Office of Accountability with primary responsibilities to include systemic program, title, and district academic program evaluations. This is pending funding availability. The District shall compensate the Agency for the work outlined in the Scope of Services in the amount of \$140,000.00, pending funding availability. This agreement supports our Pillar 1: Excellent Schools.

(06-14-22-11) To approve contracts with multiple vendors (Haddock/Promethean and TSI/SMART) to provide interactive boards and peripherals, including training & installation for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a total combined cost not to exceed \$2,000,000.00, pending funding availability. We are currently in the middle of a complete refresh of the boards with ESSER II monies and will continue with ESSER III in 2022-23. During the 2022-23 school year, this project will be rebid. This service supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1C: Financial Sustainability.

(06-14-22-12) To approve a sole source purchase from Questar Assessment Inc., as mandated by the State of Missouri, for the Missouri Assessment Program End of Course (MAP EOC) tests as scheduled on the District's testing calendar. The cost includes purchasing tests, scoring, and reporting services for the 2022-2023 school year, at a cost not exceeding \$25,000, pending funding availability. This purchase will also assist in fulfilling Pillars 1 and 4 of the transformation plan: the District creates a system of excellent schools, and all students learn to read and succeed.

(06-14-22-13) To approve a contract renewal with T-Mobile (formerly Sprint) for unlimited data on our new iPads and hotspots, not to exceed \$1,900,000, pending funding availability. This is for the period from July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, pending funding availability. This initiative is now fully reimbursable under the ECF plan of E-Rate. As a District initiative, this resolution impacts all schools—all students. This service supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1C: Financial Sustainability.

(06-14-22-14) To approve a sole source contract with Koa Hills to provide support services for the Business+ System for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$55,000. This is an ongoing contract that will provide workflow and other software updates/modifications to the current Financial application system. PowerSchool contracted Koa Hills upon implementation of their software. They assisted with the workflow and other modules during that time. Koa Hills was an integral part of the implementation. A standalone contract is now needed for continuity of services. This service supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1C: Financial Sustainability.

(06-14-22-15) To approve the renewal of purchase of service from World Press to provide bulk purchases of envelopes in various sizes and styles to cover the District's mass mailing to its students, parents, and other business mailings as so determined and to support interoffice communications to off-site locations and all schools at a cost not to exceed \$20,000, pending funding availability. Contract renewal is for July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. The mailings are managed, processed, and distributed via the District's in-house copy services. This service supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1C: Financial Sustainability.

(06-14-22-16) To approve a contract renewal with Belcan Info Services for technical personnel for the period July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$186,430, pending funding availability. Personnel is to be used in the Technology Department to support intranet, email accounts, and server administration through our specific District propriety applications. Their expertise is critical to the software applications we provide. As a District initiative, this resolution impacts all schools—all students. This service supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1C: Financial Sustainability.

(06-14-22-17) To approve a contract renewal with Apple as the sole source for technology purchases for items including iPads, Bretford iPad sync carts, professional development, and other peripherals beginning July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at an expenditure not to exceed \$6,200,000.00, pending funding availability. As a District initiative, this resolution impacts all schools—all students. This service supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1C: Financial Sustainability.

(06-14-22-18) To approve the renewal Memorandum of Understanding with Digital Promise Global for Innovative Learning Environments, including one-to-one technology for every student and teacher at Long International Middle School, Academy of Entrepreneurship Studies Middle School, Yeatman-Liddell, and Bertha Gilkey Pamoja Preparatory Academy at Cole for the period March 10, 2021, through June 30, 2023. This is the second year of a two-year partnership. This service aligns with Transformational Plan 3.0, Pillar 2: Fairness and Equity, and Goal 2A: Equity Resource and Distribution.

(06-14-22-19) To approve a renewal of the Agency Agreement with Springboard to Learning to work collaboratively with St. Louis Public Schools to establish a partnership to increase academic achievement through the integration of visual and performing arts and humanities into the core curriculum, available to all SLPS schools for the period of August 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. A cost associated with this agreement will not exceed \$125,000. This service supports Pillar 3: Culturally Responsive Environments, Goal 3C: Culturally Responsive Schools Pillar 4: Read to Succeed, Goal 4A: Student Reading Support.

(06-14-22-20) To approve a renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with the Deaconess Foundation to provide a summer camp for 100 SLPS students for the period June 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. This service supports Pillar 4: Students Read to Succeed.

(06-14-22-21) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with Junior Achievement of Greater St. Louis to provide all 5th-grade students at 39 elementary schools enrolled in personal finance with the JA BizTown curriculum and an on-site visit day for the period September 8, 2022, through June 30, 2023. Transportation is included in the budgeted District field trips. This service supports Pillar 2: Advances Equity and Fairness Across Systems, Goal 2D: Partner w/ Community Allies.

(06-14-22-22) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with Junior Achievement of Greater St. Louis to provide SLPS middle school students and high school students enrolled in personal finance with the JA Finance Park curriculum and an on-site visit day for the period September 7, 2022, through June 30, 2023. Transportation is included in the budgeted District field trips. This service supports Pillar 2: Advances Equity and Fairness Across Systems, Goal 2D: Partner w/ Community Allies.

(06-14-22-23) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with Washington University to provide students the opportunity to seek scientific careers and to increase participation of underrepresented groups in scientific careers by bringing resources and scientists directly to teachers and students through the Young Scientist Program for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. The Young Scientist Program has three arms: Teaching Teams, Summer Focus, and Continuing Mentoring, which all have different relationships with SLPS schools. Teachers request teaching Teams for field trips at the University or experiments done in classrooms and are open to all schools. Summer Focus is a summer internship for rising high school seniors; thus, all SLPS juniors are eligible and can select to apply. Continuing Mentoring partners with CSMB and Soldan High Schools and engages all grades (9-12). This partnership supports Pillar 3: Culturally Responsive Environments, Goal 3A: Career Pathways

(06-14-22-24) To approve goods and services from Preferred and Sole Source vendors for purchasing instructional materials, instructional supplies, language access resources, and supplemental instructional resources and materials that align with current standards-based instructional materials and school improvement plans. This will be funded by various funds and the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Funds (ESSER II and III) for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, not to exceed \$5,000,000. This service supports Transformation Plan 3.0 Pillar 1: Excellent Schools and Goal 1C: Financial Stability.

(06-14-22-25) To approve the purchase of services for professional development for a District team to attend the Public Education Leadership Program (PELP) at Harvard University for the period of July 5, 2022, through July 9, 2022, at a cost not to exceed \$34,000.00, pending funding availability. (06-14-22-29) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with Educational Talent Search to provide post-secondary transition services to students at all St. Louis Public High Schools, as well as AESM, Carr Lane, Compton-Drew, Gateway, Gilkey Pamoja, Long, McKinley, and Yeatmen/Liddell Middle Schools for the period July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, at no cost to the District. This service supports Pillar 4: Read to Succeed, Goal 4D: College and Career Readiness.

(06-14-22-30) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with Higher Education Consortium to provide post-secondary transition services to middle and high school youth at all St. Louis Public High Schools as well as Carr Lane, Compton-Drew, and Gateway MST Middle Schools for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at no cost to the District. This service supports Pillar 4: Read to Succeed, Goal 4D: College and Career Readiness.

(06-14-22-31) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with GatewayGIS to provide computer training and professional development for students and teachers at Clyde C. Miller Career Academy for the period July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, at no cost to the District. This service supports Pillar 4: Read to Succeed, Goal 4D: College and Career Readiness, and Pillar 5: Community Partnership Resources, Goal 5B: Cultivate Strategic Partnerships.

(06-14-22-32) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with BJC HealthCare for the Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) Programs at Gateway STEM and Clyde C. Miller Career Academy High Schools for the 2022-2023 school year. There are approximately 50 students enrolled in the CNA programs. This program was not previously utilized due to the pandemic. There is no cost to the District. This service supports Pillar 4: Read to Succeed, Goal 4D: College and Career Readiness.

(06-14-22-33) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with the Construction Career Development Initiative (CCDI) for the Construction program at Roosevelt High School for the 2022-2023 academic year. There are approximately 20 students enrolled in the Construction program. This program was not previously utilized due to the pandemic. There is no cost to the District. This service supports Pillar 4: Read to Succeed, Goal 4D: College and Career Readiness.

(06-14-22-34) To approve a contract renewal with the University of Missouri–St. Louis to provide dual credit programs to eligible 9-12th grade students at all high school sites for the period of July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$100,000.00. This service supports Pillar 4: Read to Succeed, Goal 4D: College and Career Readiness.

(06-14-22-35) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with Daugherty Business Solutions to provide hands-on training in Information Systems for students at Carnahan, Clyde C. Miller, Gateway STEM, Roosevelt, Soldan, and Vashon High Schools leading to college credits and job opportunities with St. Louis area corporations for the period July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. There is no cost to the District for this program. This service supports Pillar 4: Read to Succeed, Goal 4D: College and Career Readiness.

(06-14-22-36) To approve the purchase of perishable foods for the Career & Technical Education (CTE) Culinary and Hospitality Programs at Beaumont Technical Center and Clyde C. Miller Career Academy from U.S. Foodservice, Sysco St. Louis LLC, and Old Tyme Produce Inc. for the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a combined cost not to exceed \$40,000.00. This service supports Pillar 4: Read to Succeed, Goal 4D: College and Career Readiness.

(06-14-22-37) To approve a renewal Memorandum of Understanding with Grand Canyon to provide access to GCU's' Canyon Professional Development services, including Expert-led Professional Development, Coaching, Mentoring, Consultation, and Strategic Planning. In addition, this memorandum allows access to scholarships, certification examination tutoring and support, and courses for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. This opportunity aligns with Transformation Plan 3.0 Pillar 3, Culturally Responsive Environments; Goals 3B-Teacher Retention and 3C-Culturally Responsive Schools

(06-14-22-38) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding with the Association for Education Excellence to provide post-secondary transition services through a TRiO College Access Program to students at Vashon High School for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at no cost to the District. This service supports Pillar 4: Read to Succeed, Goal 4D: College and Career Readiness.

(06-14-22-39) To approve a contract renewal with Ideal Landscape Management to provide snow removal and grounds maintenance services in selected District schools and buildings for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$1,305,404.42, pending funding availability. This renewal covers the second year of the three-year renewal option. The contract supports Pillar 1: A System of Excellent Schools, Goal 1B: Safe & Secure Schools.

(06-14-22-40) To approve a partnership with Battelle for Kids Urban District Cohort during the period of August 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, for a cost not to exceed \$20,000 pending funding availability. Saint Louis Public Schools will send a team of central office and school leaders to collaborate with 10 to 15 teams from urban school districts to design and implement a model for scaling deeper learning in complex urban school systems across the country. This initiative supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools; Goal 2B: Equitable Resource Distribution.

(06-14-22-41) To approve a sole source contract with Hope Montessori Educational Institute to provide training for Primary Montessori Certification for teachers to take Montessori coursework during a period of July 1, 2022, through December 31, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$24,000 pending funding availability. This opportunity is open to all certificated teachers in SLPS in all elementary, middle, and high schools who apply for the available spots, with priority given to Washington Montessori School. This

opportunity aligns with Transformation Plan 3.0 Pillar 3, Culturally Responsive Environments; Goals 3B-Teacher Retention and 3C-Culturally Responsive Schools.

(06-14-22-42) To approve a contract with Cord Moving & Storage and Fry-Wagner Moving and Storage to provide moving, relocation, and temporary storage services at various District locations for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$500,000.00. With an additional 10% contingency of \$50,000.00, the total cost will be \$550,000.00, pending funding availability. The contract supports Pillar 1: A System of Excellent Schools, Goal 1B: Safe & Secure Schools.

(06-14-22-43) To approve the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding between Saint Louis Children's Hospital on behalf of its Healthy Kids Express Service to provide services to Bryan Hill, Clay, Columbia Elementary, Gateway Elementary, Hamilton, Herzog, Hodgen Elementary, Humboldt, Laclede, Lexington, Mann Elementary, Meramec, Mullanphy, Nance Elementary, Nahed Chapman New American Academy, Oak Hill, Patrick Henry, Peabody, Sigel Elementary, Washington Montessori, and Woerner and other SLPS sites as indicted by SLPS Health Services during the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. This service supports Pillar 2: Fairness Equity Across System, Goal 2B: Equitable Resource Distribution, and Pillar 5: Community Partnerships Resources, Goal 5B Cultivate Strategic Partnerships.

(06-14-22-44) To approve the renewal contracts with Assignor's Plus LLC to provide official assignor services for Girls and Boys Soccer for Middle and High schools, including scheduling and processing payments for officials for the period August 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a total combined cost not to exceed \$23,000.00, pending funding availability. All schools with soccer will utilize this service. Pillar 2: Fairness Equity Across System, Goal 2A: Equitable Resource Distribution.

(06-14-22-45) To approve the acceptance of funds for an FY2022-23 grant award from the United States Department of Justice through its "STOP School Violence" program. The award amount is \$498,532 for a project entitled "St. Louis Public Schools Safety Enhancements." Grant acceptance requires a funding match, but Title IV funding is used to fund a fourth clinical counselor who qualifies as the match. The funds will be used for investment across the District to increase surveillance, improve communication, and facilitate tracking of security incidents. In addition, four Student Support Services (SSS) clinical consultants will provide trauma-informed training at the building level. Project director Megan Marietta from SSS and Commander DeAndre Davis of security. Nichelle Hunter from the finance department is overseeing the reimbursement process. Grant supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1B: Safe Secure Schools, Pillar 5: Community Partnerships Resources, Goal 5D: Expand Private/Public Grant Engagement.

(06-14-22-46) To approve a one-year extension of a purchased service from DocuSign for e-Signature services for a period from July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a cost not to exceed \$46,000.00 DocuSign is being used to send employment offers, new hire paperwork, and contracts (teacher and administrator); with plans to use this service for employee evaluations, intent to return forms and teacher retention notices. This request supports Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1D: Efficient Equitable Staffing of the Transformation Plan 3.0.

(06-14-22-47) To approve a contract renewal with HIREtech to provide employment and income verification services for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at no cost to the District. The contract has an option to renew for two one-year periods.

(07-12-22-11) To approve an initial contract with Sown to Grow for a one-year term to provide a social and emotional platform district-wide that includes social and emotional learning tools and mental health awareness; to encourage healthy and active lifestyles district-wide; for the period of July 14, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a total combined cost not to exceed \$149,500.00. (07-12-22-12) To approve an initial contract with Rethink Ed for a one-year term to provide curriculum and support services that include social and emotional learning tools and mental health awareness; to encourage healthy and active lifestyles district-wide; for the period of July 13, 2022, through June 30, 2023, at a total combined cost not to exceed \$141,000.00. This is the first year of a three-year renewable contract. This request supports Pillar 5: Community Partnerships and Resources, Goal 5B: Cultivate Strategic Partnerships.

(07-12-22-13) To renew the memorandum of understanding (MOU) between St. Louis Public Schools (SLPS) and the St. Louis Police Department (SLPD). An approved MOU between SLPS and SLPD is required to meet the agreement on the acceptance of funds for the United States Department of Justice grant award through its "STOP School Violence" program. The awards funding was previously approved for the SLPS project entitled "St. Louis Public Schools Safety Enhancements." The attached MOU focuses on the working relationship and establishing guidelines between the SLPS security team and SLPD. The District's goal is to increase

surveillance, improve communication, and facilitate the tracking of security incidents. The original Board Resolution was #04-13-21-48. Pillar 1: Excellent Schools, Goal 1B: Safe Secure Schools.

(07-12-22-14) To approve a contract with the Missouri School Board Association to revise District Policies. MSBA will merge recommended original district language and practices with MSBA's' standard policies and procedures and provide the District with customized draft policies and procedures manual with explanatory comments as needed for a cost not to exceed \$50,000.00 for the period January 1, 2023, through December 30, 2023. This request supports Pillar 5: Community Partnerships and Resources, Goal 5B: Cultivate Strategic Partnerships.

(07-12-22-15) To approve an amendment to Board Resolution 03-08-22-04, a one-year extension to a sole source contract with Agile Sports Technologies Inc., dba "Hudl," to increase the contract by \$27,056.00 to upgrade the subscription from the Gold Package to the AD Package which will include shared-venue access and Focus Exchange Network, equal access among teams, athletes and schools, and if sites are changed, additional cameras can be added at no extra cost. If approved, the total amount of the contract will now be \$75,500, pending funding availability. The service period will remain the same, July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023.
