




Passport Reading Challenge

### Classroom Libraries: Update

#### Rationale:

 Classroom libraries serve as the cornerstone of a successful reading program. It has been well documented that access to books in school is a predictor of significant, measurable increases in students' reading scores (Krashen, et. al, 2012).


#### Proposed Plan:

- Implement updated classroom libraries across all schools in Fall 2024.
- Curate diverse, culturally responsive, and engaging texts
- Support educator understanding and use of libraries
- Promote small group instruction



#### **Learning Lab Update**

- 13 Elementary Schools
- Fall Cohort
  - o Four Schools
  - Five Learning Lab visits
- Winter Cohort
  - Nine schools
  - Three Learning Lab visits
- Observation Structure
  - Monthly observations of 3rd grade classrooms focused on ELA and student moves
  - Included the Network
     Superintendents, Principals and AICs
  - Teachers provided with real time feedback and coaching
- Third grade students in the fall cohort showed 11% more combined typical + high growth than students in the winter cohort on the STAR assessment.









# Reading and Writing Initiative: Update

The cohort of six teachers, principals, AICs, and other district staff met at Jefferson Elementary School on March 26th and 27th to:

- ✓ Continue the discussion on understanding the power of learning targets and how it sets the purpose for learning and the overall lessons used to engage students beyond recalling information in text.
- ✓ Understand how to internalize lesson plans, develop meaningful/essential questions to address performance indicators associated with the learning target.
- ✓ Learn how to use the close reading strategy so that students can annotate important information in a text.
- ✓ Plan lessons with one another.
