UPDATES SINCE COVID-19



Due to Covid-19:

Replaced our firewall to the latest model

- Product allows for blocking websites that are not educational appropriate
- □ Is a requirement due to our involvement in E-Rate
- Child Internet Protection ACT (CIPA)

Doubled our internet speed to the world wide web

- Increased the licenses on our Edge router that connects our equipment in the core network to the outside world
- Caused latency issues in some peak times throughout the day

TECHNOLOGY DISTRIBUTION





CURRENT STATUS



- 89% of our
 students have a
 District device
 - a 3% have opted out
 - 5% of current have not returned their previous equipment
 - 3% have on-site only devices

Available Usage:


- Internet connection to the world (Category 1)

- Maintenance on equipment (Category 2)
- Cabling for data & phones (Category 2)
- WiFi Replacement (WWT)
- Core Network Replacement (WWT) pending approval

No longer funds:

- Phone lines (landlines)
- Cell phone lines
- Phone system

TYPES OF ASSESSMENTS: LOCAL



STAR – Reading & Math

- Given three times a year
 - a August, December, April (SB 319)
- Provides grade level equivalency information
- Provides student growth percentile results

Scantron Achievement Series

- Locally created assessments prepared by Academics
- Provides Common Formative & Common Summative (CFA & CSA)
- Given multiple times during the year
 - Reports are aligned to the standards
 - Provides an "evidence of impact" proof

□ Aligned to the pacing guide – to assess after teaching

TYPES OF ASSESSMENTS: LOCAL



- ACT given to every 11th grade student annually
 April 5th
 - April 19th (Makeup)
- International Baccalaureate Assessments
- Advanced Placement Assessments
- MSIP expectations are aligned to these assessments

Image: Missouri Assessment Program (MAP) Assessment

□ Given in 3rd through 8th grades – annually

□ ELA, Math & Science (5th and 8th only)

End of Course Assessment (EOC)

High School courses

□ Requirement to be assessed once in:

Algebra I, English II, Biology, Government

All of these are a part of the Missouri School Improvement Program (MSIP) for accreditation; along with Federal requirements

Advanced Placement International Baccalaureate	May 2 nd – 13 th	Specific courses
