THE MUSTER

Grover Cleveland High School, built in 1913, is currently one of the magnet schools in the St. Louis Public School System. The Junior Naval Academy is the second largest Naval School in the United States, second only to Annapolis. With an enrollment of over one thousand, it is the only public school of its kind in the U.S. Every student who attends Cleveland wears the military uniform.

(Lower Left) Each day commences with the salute to the "Colors." Each company stands at attention as the flag is hoisted and the salute is trumpeted over the school's public address system. (Top Left) The Color Guard parades the colors before auditorium sessions and other activities. (Left) The school is located in the southern part of the city a mile from the Mississippi River. From the top of the building one can see the Gateway Arch to the north and the Jefferson Barracks Bridges to the south. (Below) The first Friday in May is the annual Pass in Review which follows the inspection by the Department of the Navy.

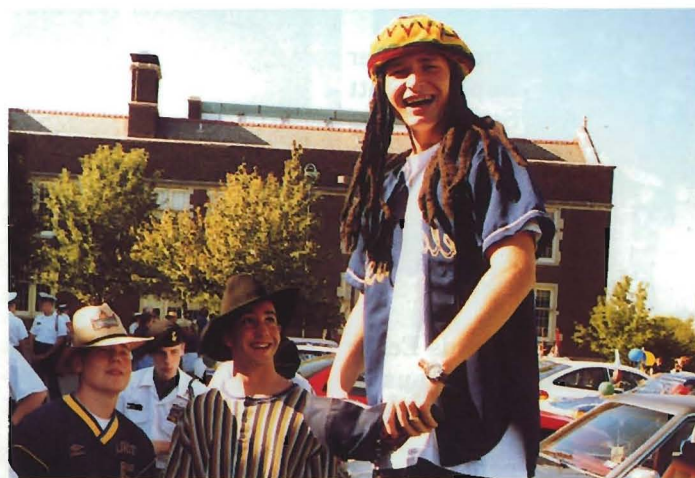

The first-cloned mammal was a sheep named Dolly. Created by scientists in Scotland, Dolly is the exact genetic copy of her mother. A second clone, Polly, was announced five months later. Polly has a human gene which scientists hope will allow the sheep to produce a human protein in its milk. This protein could help people who lack the protein, such as hemophiliacs and those with bone disease.

THE PRINCESS & THE SAINT

The deaths of Princess Diana of the United Kingdom and Nobel Peace Prize winner Mother Teresa of Calcutta within days of each other caused the world to compare these two women.

Diana died August 31 of injuries suffered in a car crash in Paris. In the final years of her life, Diana championed many worthy causes, including AIDS research and the movement to ban land mines.

"England's Rose," a song sung at the funeral by pop star Elton John was sold as a single and raised millions of dollars for a foundation which will support Diana's many charitable causes.

Mother Teresa died five days after the Princess on September 5, at the age of 87. During her life, Mother Teresa — who was often called a living saint — did many good works, including founding a Christian order, health clinics, orphanages, centers for the malnourished, and homes for alcoholics and drug addicts.
