CVPA Student Art Work Featured at Historic Souland Oktoberfest

These images trace the progress of our students' work for the Souland Oktoberfest. Our students created a Jackson-Pollock-style splatter painting on heavy muslin that was five feet tall and more than a full mile wide. Students worked on this monumental piece of work for nearly two months.

The painting was then divided into 200 yard pieces and transported to the site of the Souland Oktoberfest on Geyer and South Broadway. Our students also measured and cut to length a solid mile of blue and white muslin to line the ceilings of the Souland Oktoberfest tents.
