

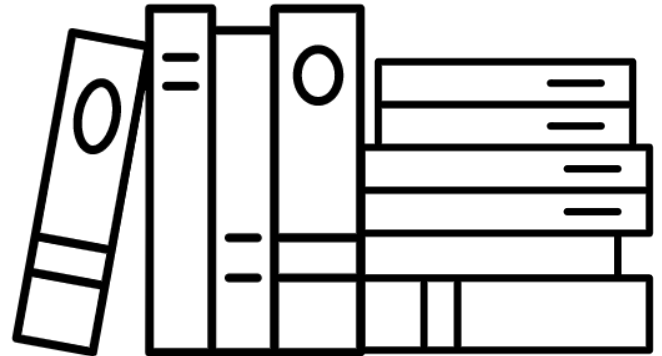

## Welcome

to AP Literature



Advanced placement Literature and Composition is a rigorous, college level course, in which students study the art of reading and writing about great literature. Throughout the course, students will be assessed on their ability to effectively and cogently communicate their ideas about what they read, both orally and in writing. Students will be given multiple opportunities to practice these skills before they take their AP Exam in May. Most highly competitive college and universities will award college credit for your successful completion of the examination (a score of 3, 4, or 5 on the 5 scale of evaluation). The most competitive schools require a score of 4 or 5. To help you accomplish your goal, we will cover a significant number of works thoroughly rather than a great number of works superficially and sharpen your skills in analysis, synthesis, and evaluation

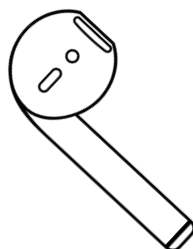
